MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



The year 2020 was not even close to what anyone had planned, imagined or wanted.

The pandemic hit all of us hard and turned our daily traditional life upside down. We got physically separated from those we care about; our everyday routine dramatically changed; many of us lost someone precious.

Our hobby was no exception either. Breeders had to put their ongoing breeding programmes on hold. Trainers lost the chance to compare their achievements at sport competitions. Breed clubs and national canine organisations had to face utterly uncertain circumstances while trying to go on with their services and doing their best to protect their employees. Sport events and dog shows got cancelled. Besides the financial loss, all the energy and efforts of the organisers have also gone to waste. Furthermore, we all had to struggle through with our own personal matters as well.

We lost opportunities. But we did not lose ourselves. The world stopped, and seemingly nothing happened. Still, under the surface, so many new directions emerged during this time of loneliness. If you take a closer look, you can see that such a drastic challenge triggered a change. We had the chance to be alone together with our thoughts. We got forced to master new skills. We had to reconsider what really matters. Going through these hard times while staying strong demands character, dedication, professionalism. Life will get back to normal, and we will be standing there stronger and wiser.

It seems, as everything stopped, that nothing happened in 2020. But we all worked a lot, tried

to solve difficulties and helped others in need. Paradoxically, physical isolation brought us closer, making our international unity even stronger. All of us could feel that no one is alone!

First of all, the FCI is alive and operating. Several new initiatives got launched or were completed. We conducted numerous negotiations related to the new dates of Section and World Shows with the organisers to find an ultimate suitable solution for everyone.

To keep up with the requirements of the current era, we established new communication tools, such as the FCI for YouTube channel and our Instagram account. We also modernised our website and our Facebook page. Besides providing information to our members, we also opened a window for the broader society to make them acquainted with our activities and the benefits they could get from them.

In order to achieve that, we set up several campaigns with the help of our new PR team. We engaged our breeders and also reached people outside of the FCI to inform them about what pedigree dogs can provide to the different fields of society.

The FCI issued - and sent to all its Members and Contract Partners - professional guidelines about the Brachycephalic "issue", backed with scientific research and statistics for further use in every country (where needed). We agreed with The Kennel Club to license its functional testing system for brachycephalic breeds in order to improve the welfare of dogs and fight BOAS.

As a game-changer, we created the brand new FCI Committee for Dog Welfare and Health with the participation of experts from in-and-outside of the FCI. This new Committee sets our priorities focusing on our determination to handle those vital matters and to pile up international knowledge and expertise with the purpose of establishing guidelines for all our Members and Contract Partners.

I personally thank for the work and dedication of everyone involved in the activity of the FCI.

I thank all our Members and Contract partners, my colleagues in the FCI General Committee, the FCI Office, and anyone involved in any kind of activity, for their positive and cooperative attitude.

Hard times always make it obvious who you can trust. Therefore, I thank all of you on whom the FCI could and can count.

Introduction

Established in 1911, the FCI includes 99 Members and Contract Partners (one member per country). Each Member issues their own pedigrees and train highly-qualified judges. The FCI makes sure that the pedigrees and judges are mutually recognised by all the FCI members, Contract Partners and any person involved in their domestic canine scene.

In accordance with the celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the Fédération Cynologique Internationale, the FCI General Committee reviewed its Mission, Vision Statement and Values to maintain the Association's leadership worldwide.

In 2018, further to the decision of the FCI Extraordinary General Assembly, FCI's Mission, Vision Statements and Values were revised as follows:

Mission and Vision statement

The FCI is the highest authority of the canine culture and supports, via its Members and Contract Partners, the well-being of pedigree dogs worldwide as well as their selective breeding and generational registrations. The FCI is responsible for safeguarding pedigree dogs' health and international pedigree dog activities to enhance the relations between dogs and humans. The FCI recognises that the following principles and professional responsibilities are fundamental for the well-being of all pedigree dogs worldwide:

Values

- a/ The FCI considers pedigree dogs' health, temperament and behaviour of utmost importance in Breed Standards.
- b/ The FCI promotes pedigree dogs' activities and sports worldwide, which it considers beneficial for the pedigree dogs.
- c/ The FCI entrusts its commissions to make recommendations about other important matters.
- d/ The FCI divides geographically the world of pedigree dogs through its three (3) sections.
- e/ The FCI trusts its Members and Contract Partners to protect the integrity of their National Registries.
- f/ The FCI recognises and respects agreements with non-member national organisations.
- g/ The FCI sets the highest standards for its Head Office.
- h/ The FCI ensures the regular celebration of World and Section Championship events.

Die FCI stellt sicher, dass die Ahnentafeln und Richter innerhalb der FCI von allen Mitgliedern, Vertragspartnern und allen in der Hundeszene tätigen Personen anerkannt werden.

Im Rahmen des 100-jährigen Jubiläums der Fédération Cynologique Internationale hat der FCI-Vorstand seine Mission-Statement und seine Vision-Statement sowie die Werte überarbeitet um die weltweite Führungsposition der Vereinigung in der Kynologie zu erhalten.

In 2018 wurden nach Beschluss der Außerordentlichen Generalversammlung der FCI Mission-, Vision-Statement und Werte der FCI wie folgt überarbeitet:

Mission und Vision-statement

Die FCI ist die höchste Autorität für Hundekultur und unterstützt über ihre Mitglieder und Vertragspartner das Wohlergehen von Hunden mit Ahnentafel weltweit sowie ihre selektive Zucht und genealogische Registrierung.

Sie ist für die Gewährleistung der Gesundheit von Hunden mit Ahnentafel und internationaler Aktivitäten mit Hunden mit Ahnentafel zur Förderung der Beziehungen zwischen Hunden und Menschen verantwortlich.

- d/** Die FCI unterteilt die Welt der Hunde mit Ahnentafel geographisch anhand ihrer drei (3) Sektionen.
- e/** Sie vertraut ihren Mitgliedern und Vertragspartnern, dass sie die Integrität ihrer nationalen Register schützen.
- f/** Die FCI anerkennt und respektiert Abkommen mit nationalen Hundeverbänden, die keine FCI-Mitglieder sind.
- g/** Für ihre Geschäftsstelle setzt sie höchste Maßstäbe.
- h/** Die FCI sorgt für die regelmäßige Durchführung von Championaten auf Welt- und Sektionsebene.

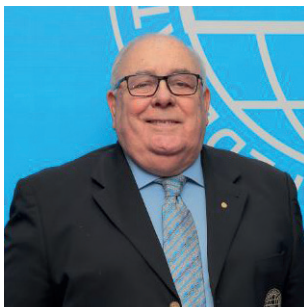

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Dear FCI Members and Contract Partners,

What a weird but mostly dramatic year 2020. Who could have expected or predicted that such a horrible and awful situation could ever arise? Instead of fun, hobby, joy and pleasure, our key words were and still are resilience, patience and caution. Covid-19 has been haunting our lives since March 2020.

Last March and July 2020, we were informed that **Dr Göran Bodegård**, Swedish FCI All-Breed international judge, and **Mr Tibor Lovrencic**, FCI All-Breed international judge, sadly died.



Among all SKK judges, Dr Bodegård had been in service for the longest time (since 1966). He was a well-known and respected judge. I again want to express my sincere condolences to Dr Bodegaard's family and to the Swedish canine scene.



Mr Tibor Lovrencic died in Zagreb, Croatia, at the age of 103. The elder of Croatian cynology was a judge for more than 50 years.

His last judging appointment was in 2010 at the Champion of Champions event in Zagreb.

I want to express my sincere condolences to Dr Bodegaard's and Mr Lovrencic's families and to the Swedish and Croatian canine scenes.

There may be more persons who passed away and for whom we were not notified; I apologise if I have failed to mention them!

As you can expect, after a promising beginning, the activities of our Members and Contract Partners were severely affected by the pandemic Covid-19, and as of today, there is not yet a truly bright light at the end of the tunnel.

While in 2019, a total of 1,224 international CACIB shows were organised, for a total entry of 939,955 dogs, in 2020, the figures were much lower with 360 shows conducted (out of a total of 430 approve to be held) and a total of 277,048 dogs entered. Hopefully, 2021 will show signs of a clear and sustainable trends upwards even if we should not expect miracles to happen.

Dog Health and Welfare

Definitely, the year 2020 was intensively focused on dog's health and welfare. The BOAS issue was followed-up and resulted in the FCI offering its Members and Contract Partners the possibility to adopt the *Respiratory Function Grading Scheme* (RFGS), in the frame of a very friendly cooperation with its cooperating Partner, the Kennel Club.



In addition, a wealth of information related to that topic was collected and shared, through a questionnaire sent to the FCI Members and Contract Partners. The information is available at <http://www.fci.be/en/Healthy-Breeding-Dog-Welfare-informative-package-3573.html>

The FCI General Committee, aware of the importance of the "health" topic, created the **FCI Committee for Dog Welfare and Health**, chaired by Dr José Luis Payró (MX). High expectations are placed in the work of that Committee.

Covid-19: our measures to help our Members and Contract Partners

Faced with the pandemic of Covid-19, the FCI General Committee tried to find ways to help the Members and Contract Partners. The legal deadline to pay the invoices was extended from 90 to 180 days, the requirements related to show applications were waived (300-km ruling, 1-year term for the applications ruling, possibility to have CACIB shows with local judges only) and the conditions to be eligible for the titles of International Champion were softened. May I invite all national canine organisations (NCO) to contact the FCI Head Office in case they need extra information?

Dögel/Working Dogs

As all of you were informed, as of September 2020, the FCI officially put an end to its cooperation with Dögel/Working Dogs, a company mostly dedicated to live-streaming on our major events.

FCI Judges Directory

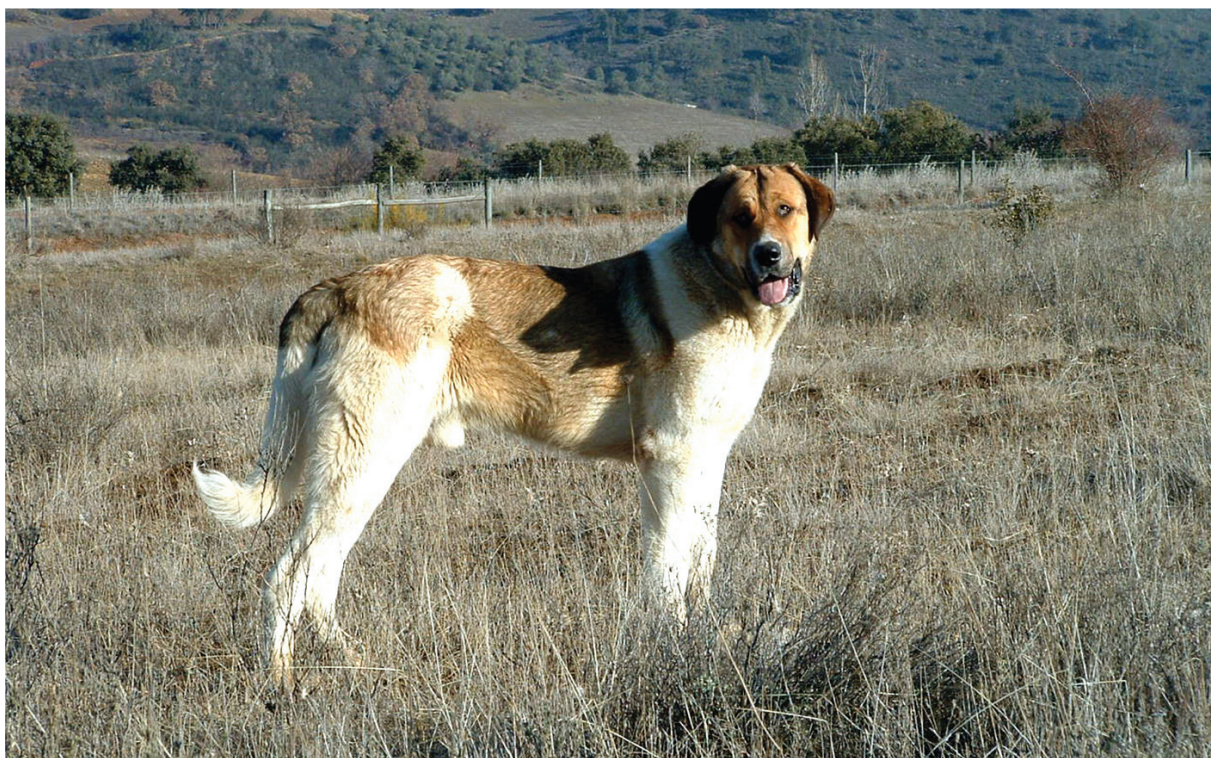

The FCI General Committee approved the recognition, on a **provisional basis**, of the **Cao de Gado Transmontano** (Transmontano Mastiff) (368) (PT). The breed is not yet eligible for the CACIB.

Court case “WUSV (13 member clubs) vs FCI”

A court case was initiated by 13 German Shepherd Dog breed clubs, affiliated to the WUSV and not to the FCI-NCO, against the FCI. As the case is still ongoing, I cannot make any comment, but simply reassure you that the FCI and its lawyers are doing their utmost to show our commitment in favour of pedigree dogs, in the best interest of our Members and Contract Partners, and in full compliance with the European Union legislation.

FCI World Dog Shows 2020 and 2022

On another note, I would also like to particularly thank *the Confederação Brasileira de Cinofilia* (CBKC), *the Real Sociedad Canina de España* (RSCE) and *the Société Centrale Canine* (SCC) for their spirit of cooperation and understanding and their flexibility in finding a suitable solution to set final dates for the 2020 and 2022 FCI World Dog Shows. In addition to finding suitable dates, it was agreed that the title

of FCI DOG OF THE YEAR 2022 will also be granted to the dogs that earn the title of “FCIWorld Winner”, “FCI-Junior Winner” or “FCI-Veteran Winner” (in the Adult, Junior and Veteran classes) at both FCI World Dog Shows, in Madrid and Sao Paulo. Please save the following dates:

24-26 June 2022, 2020 FCI WDS, Madrid

10-11 December 2022, FCI WDS, Brazil

To end up, let me express my warmest thanks to the FCI General Committee members, the FCI Members and Contract Partners, to all the presidents of the FCI commissions and to our devoted FCI Staff for their good cooperation, despite the awful period that we are all going through.

FCI AGILITY COMMISSION - Activity report

Last year I could talk about 40 years Agility under the roof of the FCI. It is the most growing dog sport worldwide. Agility is that kind of dog-sport, which has the only international FCI event where only kids and juniors are allowed to start and, believe me, not only a "handful" of kids and juniors participate, but more than 450 of them. It is always a special atmosphere because the kids do not have any language barrier, they do not think racially. They do not make any distinction between red, yellow, black or white. They look at how friendly the child / junior is with their dog and what the team does in Agility. They make friends around the world and Skype, or even just writing emails is very helpful for these connections.

I talked to a mum and she told me a bit about her daughter. Both parents do active Agility and the little daughter joined their trainings and competitions and she started very early with Agility, she was only 5 years old and with seven she started first time in a competition. She is gaining so much more self-confidence. Yes, the development is really, really huge. She has gained so many agility skills in such a short period. This is just amazing. I never saw Agility from that side and learned that scientists confirmed the information, I got from that mother.

For that it is a pity, that these kids and juniors did not have the opportunity to meet each other this year personally because of the pandemic.

We all will remember the year 2020, not because there were great results in Agility, but because more than two-thirds of all events worldwide were cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Unfortunately, all of our international events like the JOAWC, the EO and the AWC did not take place, and even our judges' workshop - planned for springtime in Moscow and postponed to the end of December to St. Petersburg - had to be cancelled. 19 countries would have send international FCI-judges to this workshop.

Some of the events could be postponed to 2021, some others had to be postponed to 2022, because the organisation of the 2021 international events was already too far advanced, be it through existing contracts for the event-places or hotel accommodations that had already been contractually agreed.

A big THANK to all organising committees and all volunteers, who would allow us to be their guest, even if they worked hard this year and need to start next year again.

In February 2020, the delegates of the FCI-Agility Commission had the last physical meeting.

It was a two-day meeting in Tallinn (Estonia). The Estonian canine organisation was our host and took care of all of us. Many thanks to them for their friendly hospitality.

We had a good meeting. We changed some points in the guidelines for judges, we selected judges for the next international events; we consulted the working groups, who are responsible for collecting applications from the NCO, to check whether they want to change something at the Agility rules. At the moment there is a big point, which we started discussing in the meeting - and in the meantime we got 10 applications for changing the heights for the categories from 3 classes into 4 or 5 classes with different jump heights. The argument is that it could be better for the dog's health. We will see what the result is. To work this way saves time during the meetings, because all delegates got these applications, so they were able to discuss the different ideas in their national committees and, at our next meeting (personal or video conference), we will see what the final result will be.

The FCI-members of the commission had connections via e-mail and if things needed to be decided, we did it at the moment this way.

For that we have another issue for discussion: the current unfortunate situation with COVID-19 emphasizes the need to be able to work effectively, even without physical meetings. However, even after physical meetings have resumed, the work of the FCI Agility Commission could be made more effective by allowing more extensive preparation work, considering that we normally meet only twice per year. Another advantage is that it makes it easier for new representatives in the commission to catch up with earlier discussions.

Chat messages to discuss various topics (largely replacing mail as used today): such chat messages should be split into several discussion threads or topics.

FCI BREEDING COMMISSION - Activity report

The FCI Breeding Commission regularly meets once a year, end of May or beginning of June. This year, we were kindly invited to held our meeting in Moscow, but it was postponed for obvious reasons, in hope that September would be a better time and that travel restrictions would have been lifted. The situation with Covid-19 still prevented travel, thus a consensual decision to organise an online meeting was naturally made.

The situation was unusual for all the delegates; in every new thing there are good aspects any, maybe, a few negative ones. It is rather natural to expect that some delegates may have technical difficulties and connection problems, but in general it all went well. The positive side is definitely a fact that geographical representation of member countries was wider than usually.

The meeting covered many different subjects and had heated discussions about health issues and overall problems with brachycephalic breeds. We agreed

that the work of the Breeding Commission could be improved by creating a working group to cooperate in preparing better and more clearly worded proposals and statements.

The main topics were: coat colours (description of coat colours on Export Pedigrees, as well as universal nomenclature of coat colours), amendments of the International Breeding Rules and of the regulations regarding kennel names, issues regarding the registration of litters born in a country different from this of the breeder's legal residency, issues regarding the registration of dogs of incorrect colour.

A presentation regarding problems with inverted canines was given, as well as an overview of a situation regarding brachycephalic breeds in The Netherlands.

The Coronavirus has brought many disappointments, but it has also taught us to appreciate the possibilities we have had even more. Many national canine organisations have put great efforts into hosting wonderful and safe national championships and events. I personally had the pleasure of taking part in a fabulous Danish Dog Dancing Championship held at the National Horse Centre and hosted by the Danish canine organisation. Also Russia, Norway, Finland and Germany are among those who have been successful in organising and running their championships in a safe manner – just to mention a few. Since the international events have been impossible to hold this year, we are extra grateful to everyone working hard to keep dog sports alive nationally.

Meetings

The FCI Dog Dancing Commission met in July 2020 for a very efficient meeting held online via Zoom. 13 countries were represented at the meeting and we had some important issues on the agenda.

One of the great accomplishments of the Commission this year is that we now have a set of rules for arranging the European Open Championships under FCI regulations. We are very happy to now have an open championship, as well as the World Championship, so that we can embrace all dogs and handlers, and promote happy and well-trained dogs even more.

We are also preparing to introduce international competitions with the possibility of competing for the CACID Heelwork To Music, CACID Freestyle and the international championship titles. This is a big step for the sport and for further international cooperation and cohesion.

FCI SHOWS COMMISSION - Activity report

This is my first annual report as President of the FCI Shows Commission – and what a year to look back on.

The 2020 FCI Shows and Show Judges Commissions' meetings took place on the 1-2 February 2020 in lovely Mallorca, Spain.

Mr Eduardo González Gilbert, from the Spanish canine organisation (Real Sociedad Canina de España - RSCE) welcomed the delegates from 31 different countries and the guests. From the FCI General Committee, we had the honour of having the former President of the Shows Commission, Mrs Barbara Müller as the General Committee representative, Mr Tamás Jakkel, President of FCI, as representative from Hungary and Mr Augusto Benedicto Santos III,

President of the FCI Asia, Africa & Oceania Section, as representative from the Philippines.

The meeting agenda contained several points.

Reports from the observers from World and Section Shows in 2019

- At the time of this meeting, the FCI had not yet approved the observer report from the World Dog Show in Shanghai, China.
- In the future, observers will be appointed by the FCI General Committee upon proposal from the FCI Sections.

Point 8. FCI Judges Directory

- DECISION: The matter will be discussed at the Joint Commission meeting.

Point 9. Ethics in Show Judging – Time Spent

Points 10 - 11. International Junior Beauty and Veteran Beauty Champion: project of the new FCI titles

- DECISION: Recommend to the FCI to add new titles, International Junior Champion and International Veteran Champion Titles.
- DECISION of the FCI General Committee: in 2021, the GA will be asked to vote for charging the FCI titles.

Points 12. - 14. Proposals to look over parts of the regulations for the FCI International Championship and of WCC forms

- DECISION: The Commission decided to leave it as it is.

Point 15. Code of Ethics and Point 16. “Typical features of its sex”

- DECISION: will be referred to the Judges Commission.

Point 17. Shows regulation - Article 6 Qualifications and Placings

The four best dogs in each class are placed, provided that they have been awarded at least the qualification “VERY GOOD”. This rule is not being respected by some of the member countries and the dogs that get a “very good” are excused from the ring before the placing. Same procedure at all International Shows.

- DECISION: follow the FCI Regulations.

Point 18. Shows regulation - Article 7 RCACIB

The Reserve CACIB is awarded to the second best dog, which was given the qualification “EXCELLENT” from the above-mentioned classes. The dog placed second in the class where the CACIB winner comes from can compete for the Reserve CACIB, if awarded excellent. It is not compulsory to award the Reserve CACIB. This rule is not being respected by some of the member countries. It should be the same procedure at all International Shows.

- DECISION: follow the FCI Regulations.

Point 19. Shows regulation - Bitches in whelp

Proposal to include, in the Shows Regulation, that pregnant bitches 30 days or less before whelping and bitches within 75 days after giving birth will not be allowed to be shown.

- DECISION: recommend to the FCI General Committee to include in the shows regulations that bitches should not be allowed to be shown 35 days before and 60 days after giving birth.

- DECISION of the FCI General Committee: the proposal is turned down, as it is impossible to check.

Point 20. Shows regulation - Article 4 Special Requirements

Admission of dogs Group 11 - Non-FCI recognised breeds (point from last meeting to include in the agenda: the creation of Group 11).

- DECISION: every NCO is entitled to hold separate competitions for their native breeds in the main ring of the show, whether or not these breeds are recognised by the FCI.

- DECISION of the FCI General Committee: each NCO is entitled to hold separate competitions in the main ring for their native or nationally recognised breeds, whether or not FCI recognised.

Point 21. Champion Class

A clarification regarding a Champion dog from one country: will it be allowed to compete in Open Class or CAC class in another country?

- DECISION: the Commission has decided to leave the FCI Shows Regulation as it is.

Point 22. Election

- 22.1 Election of the President

Three candidates were announced: Mr Luis Catalan (Portugal), Mr Wilfred Olsen (Denmark) and Mr Leif-Herman Wilberg (Norway).

During the presentation round, Mr Leif-Herman Wilberg withdraw his candidacy.

Mr Wilfred Olsen got 21 votes. Mr Luis Catalan got 10 votes.

Consequently, Mr Wilfred Olsen was elected new President of the FCI Shows Commission.

- 22.2 Election of the Vice-president

Two candidates were announced: Ms Aida Rivera Franco (Colombia) and Mr Bojan Matakovic (Croatia). Mr Bojan Matakovic got 18 votes. Ms.Aida Rivera Franco got 13 votes.

Consequently, Mr Bojan Matakovic was elected new Vice-president of the FCI Shows Commission.

- 22.3 Election of the Secretary

One candidate: Ms Ekaterina Domogatskaya (Russia), elected as new Secretary of the FCI Shows Commission.



Point 23. Sundries

Dog import. Question about the European legislation called: REGULATION (EU) No 576/2013 OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL of 12 June 2013 on the non-commercial movement of pet animals and repealing Regulation (EC) No 998/2003 and the COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING REGULATION (EU) No 577/2013 of 28 June 2013 on the model identification documents for the non-commercial movement of dogs, cats and ferrets, the establishment of lists of territories and third countries and the format, layout and language requirements of the declarations attesting compliance with certain conditions provided for in Regulation (EU) No 576/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council.

DECISION: The Commission will ask the General Committee to send information to all countries regarding the regulation in their countries about importing a dog.

- DECISION of the FCI General Committee: Approved.

Now I had hoped, I could write about many great highlights from the year in the different countries and regions – in my first year as President for the FCI Shows Commission, BUT – it has been an awful year with lots of cancelled shows due to the Covid-19 situation.

The World Dog Show in Madrid, Spain, has been postponed until 2022.

The European Section show in Celje, Slovenia, has been postponed until 2021.

The America and the Caribbean Section show in San Jose, Costa Rica, has been postponed until 2021.

Moreover, the Asia, Africa and Oceania Section show in Bangkok, Thailand on 7 November has been changed to a “normal CACIB show” and may not be

very “international”, because of all the closed borders and lockdowns all over the world.

Right now, we can conclude that there are more CACIB shows that have been cancelled than the number of completed CACIB shows.

A total of 1396 CACIB shows were planned, but unfortunately only 605 CACIB shows were held.

The number distributed by section: Europe 414 CACIB shows completed and 555 cancelled, The Americas & the Caribbean 115 CACIB shows completed and 555 cancelled. Asia, Africa & Oceania 76 CACIB shows completed and 160 cancelled.

Some of our member countries did not have any or only a few CACIB shows during 2020. Already at present, we know that several CACIB shows in 2021 will also be cancelled.

I would like to thank all the delegates from our meeting in Mallorca in the beginning of the year. Thanks very much for your support by electing me as new President of the Commission. Thanks to my colleagues in the Shows Commission, Ms Ekaterina Domogatskaya and Mr Bojan Matakovic, and to my cooperating President from the Show Judges Commission, Mr Adrian Landarte. My thanks go as well to the FCI office, to Mr Yves De Clercq and his professional staff, and to our representative from the FCI General Committee, Ms Barbara Müller.

Let us together look forward to a much better 2021, with lots of activities and a world that returns to a safe and normal everyday life – with lots of great shows.

FCI COMMISSION FOR HERDING DOGS – Activity report

Annual meeting

The annual meeting of the FCI Herding Dogs Commission had to be cancelled due to the spreading of the Covid-19 virus in spring.

FCI Herding events

In 2020, the number of FCI Herding Trials was less than usual, due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In half of our countries, the organising of trials - even without public - was not allowed.

This had consequences for the planned FCI European Herding Championship in 2021. It would not be fair and it would not be a real European championship if only competitors of a few countries would have a chance to qualify.

Therefore, the FCI Herding Dogs Commission made a decision to postpone the FCI European Herding Championship to 2022.

New FCI rules for livestock guarding dogs

At the Commission meeting, it was decided to organise a working group to develop rules for testing and trials for dogs which are used to protect flocks.

The working group on the preparation of rules for livestock guardian dogs was selected:

The Working Group for Rules for Livestock Guarding Dogs did a good job preparing rules for a test especially for these breeds. These rules were approved by the FCI Herding Dogs Commission and presented to the General Committee in 2018.

Amendments to existing rules:

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ORGANISATION OF FCI HERDING EVENTS: the Commission proposed some minor amendments to the General Conditions, adding the tests for livestock guarding dogs.

New and revised Rules for FCI Herding

In 2018, the Working Group proposed a new set of Rules for the FCI Collecting Style, which was approved in the meeting of the Commission.

The new rules consist of:

FCI RULES FOR HERDING WORKING TEST
COLLECTING STYLE

FCI RULES FOR INTERNATIONAL HERDING TRIALS
COLLECTING STYLE

These rules were approved by the General Committee.

FCI HERDING TESTS AND TRIALS

FCI Herding is a rather young discipline. The first FCI Rules for Herding Tests and Trials have been valid since January 1st, 2008.

At the start in 2018, the Commission expected that there would be few possible training places and facilities to organise trials. And it had to be seen if pedigree dogs still possessed the qualities to perform their original jobs.

Still in many countries, it is difficult to organise more than a few trials per year, depending on the climate, the landscape and on the cooperation of sheep farmers and shepherds with sufficient and suitable sheep.

Nowadays, the Traditional Style (for all shepherd dog breeds, except Border Collie) is more popular than the FCI Collecting Style.

In 2019, in 15 countries all over Europe, tests and trials Traditional Style were organised.

In general, the number of international trials is increasing, the number of participants is increasing, the number of participating breeds is increasing. And, last but not least, the quality of the work of dogs and handlers has impressively improved!

In many countries, shepherds and sheep farmers are getting more and more interested in working pedigree dogs, which are doing so well in tests and trials.

Really remarkable is that many participating dogs in Herding Trials also are show champions. Beautiful and sound inside and outside!

The list of breeds which may participate in FCI Herding Tests and Trials is drawn up by the Herding Dogs Commission by studying the breed standards, especially the chapters 'History' and 'Utilisation', and by looking for evidence that dogs of these breeds are still working on sheep or cattle.

The list is composed of 48 breeds, spread over different FCI Breed Groups. Among these 48 breeds, 18 need a working test according to the FCI nomenclature.

The breeds in the Traditional Style vary in the way they move, in size, coat and working style. It is remarkable that so much talent for herding still is present.

Since January 1st, 2013 in the highest class of the Herding Trials, a CACITR (Certificat d'Aptitude au Championnat International de Troupeau de la FCI) may be awarded. It is one of the conditions for dogs to qualify for the title of FCI Herding Champion.

All shepherd dogs, those which need a working tests and those who do not, are eligible for the title of FCI Herding Champion as a recognition of their herding abilities. However, this title does not qualify for the FCI Working Champion title, nor for entering the Utility Class in CACIB-shows. The FCI Herding Working Test can qualify dogs of 'working breeds' which pass the HWT to enter in the Utility Class.

One of the first FCI Herding Champions was a Shetland Sheepdog. Small in size, big in his mind when worked on the flock. The smallest dog which succeeded in the lowest level, NHAT, is a Schipperke. The biggest dogs which compete are dogs like Beaucerons, German Shepherd dogs, etc.

FCI RALLY OBEDIENCE COMMISSION - Activity report

First of all let me introduce this kind of dog sports, which is maybe new to some of you:

Rally Obedience (also known as „Rally“ or „Rally-O“) is a dog sport based on obedience. It was originally devised by Charles L. “Bud” Kramer from the obedience practice of “doodling” — doing a variety of interesting warmup and freestyle exercises. The doodles were usually parts of obedience exercises that taught the skills and improved performance and accuracy. w

Unlike regular obedience, instead of waiting for the judge’s orders, the competitors proceed around a course of designated stations with the dog in heel position. The course consists of 10 to 25 signs that instruct the team what to do. Unlike traditional obedience, handlers are allowed to encourage their dogs during the course.

In the past 15 years, Rally Obedience has become very popular in many of our countries. In my home country Austria, for example, the first official regulations were set up in 2016 and since that the popularity has grown enormously, becoming the 3rd most popular official dog activity in our country.

Looking through the countries, the variety of different national regulations set up shows an interesting mix of exercises: in some countries, for example, the possibility to change the heelside (left or right handling) was determined, in others the mix of two or more signs (so-called „More Signs Exercises“) has given a wider space for judges to create new courses.

Since the sport is more and more professional and the call for international competitions has got noisier, the FCI General Assembly decided in 2017 to create a specific Commission to take care of international regulations for this lovely sort of working together with our „best friend“.

After the first meeting in Helsinki (Finland) end of 2018, where first points were set up, the FCI Rally Obedience Commission had its next important meeting in Denmark, end of 2019. All delegates were invited to visit the 1st Nordic Championship for Rally Obedience, which was held as a 2-day event in the city of Ringsted, giving a general impression of how an international competition with international rules could work (the Nordic Committee for Rally Obedience had unified about the rules before). See some photos of this event for impression. At this meeting, the Commission decided to work together on the 1st International rules for Rally-Obedience and officially submitted to arrange the 1st FCI Rally Obedience World Winner in 2023/2024.

In 2020, many of our plans were thwarted – the COVID-19 pandemic forced us to cancel our face-to-face meetings in Tallinn and Vienna, and to organise brief online meetings, which reduced the speed of our work. Since Mrs Iiris Harju, elected President of the Commission, resigned in August 2020 due to professional reasons, I am leading the FCI Rally Obedience Commission as acting President until the next elections, end of 2021, which is a real honour.

In the last months of 2020, we will have two online meetings via Skype, where we will unite and fix up the set of signs used in international regulations. After that, we will discuss the first drafts of our general regulations. All members of the Commission are looking forward to a better year 2021, hoping to meet again in a face-to-face meeting in Vienna (Austria), in the middle of April.

Our only official activity in 2020 was our annual Commission meeting in Craiova (Romania), on 29th February and 1st March.



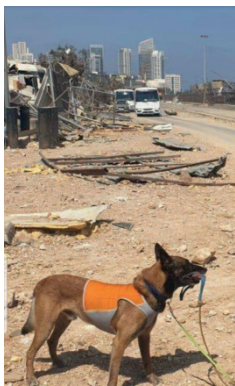

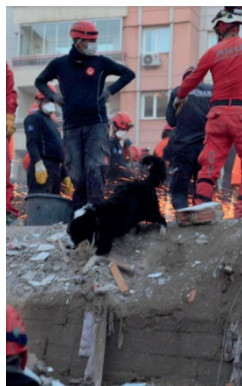
CHAPTER VII - OUR COMMISSIONS

FCI SHOW JUDGES COMMISSION - Activity report

The Real Sociedad Canina de España was the host of our annual meeting that was held in Palma de Mallorca on February 1st, with 31 delegates coming from FCI full member countries, 12 guests and Mrs Barbara Müller as FCI representative. On Sunday we had a joint meeting together with the FCI Shows Commission. The meetings were at Melia Palma Marina Hotel with a spectacular view of the Marina; everything was very well set and perfectly organised. Everything took place in a climate of friendship and camaraderie, Those present shared two days of hard work, with an extensive agenda in meetings. In our free time we had the opportunity to visit the wonderful island and taste its excellent cuisine. We congratulate and thank our RSCE hosts, delegates Mr Eduardo González and Manuel Ramírez, for the perfect job and for giving all of us a memorable and very pleasant stay.

Here we present the headlines of some of the topics covered that were carefully discussed in our meeting. Those interested can read more information in the minutes of the meetings.

Breed-by-breed education

We slowly continue to receive and post presentations for some breeds. There are currently about 30 breeds published on the FCI website. We hope that our organisations understand the importance of having a detailed presentation, video or report, prepared by the breed's country of origin.

Basic education programme

We have been working in this programme for several meetings and, in Mallorca, its final structure was approved, with all the points that should be included.

Now we face the challenge to develop and make detailed presentations of each of the programme's points. As an example, excellent presentations about movement by John Wauben and one about eyes made by Gerardo Paulucci were shown.

As it is an extensive and complete programme, it would be impossible to approve it as a whole in a meeting. For this reason, the Commission decided to divide it into chapters and approve the parts separately.

We invite and encourage all members who are specialists or feel capable and confident to develop certain topics to please do so. Those who want to collaborate in this project, please do not hesitate to contact us.

FCI World Judges congress

France applied for the organisation of the 2021 World Congress and Russia presented the programme of an international congress of judges with the support of FCI that would be held in Moscow, in November 2020. Unfortunately, due to the global COVID pandemic, both events had to be cancelled.

The organisation of the 2022 World Congress was confirmed together with the WDS in Brazil.

Guidelines of Judges techniques for FCI Judges

The Commission approved the idea of creating a manual of judging techniques. A presentation of the project was made, and a working group was appointed who will be in charge of its preparation to be approved at our next meeting.

Judges behaviour in social media

The working group made an excellent presentation. We discussed the issue extensively, finally reaching the approval of a final proposal that was sent to the FCI General Committee.

Judges regulations

Proposals were also made to change the current regulations for the training and nomination of judges, modifying articles 6b, 6d and 7 of the regulations. Said proposals were sent to the FCI General Committee for its study and approval.

Joint meetings with our colleagues from the Shows Commission

Like every year, we also organised a joint meeting with the Shows Commission. The meeting was on February 2nd. We talk about topics that involve both commissions. We also informed each other about the specific topics that can have an influence on the other Commission.



We discussed some points like:

Code of Ethics for exhibitors/handlers at FCI Shows

The Commission agreed it could be good to have a Code of Ethics and decided to put the topic on the agenda for next year, and named a working group to study possibilities and to present it in Italy in 2021.

FCI Judges Directory

The topic was discussed a lot, most of the countries present agree that the new format has flaws and is less friendly. It does not show very important and necessary information about the listed judges. It is a necessary and very useful tool for all organisations, and it should be fast, easy and complete.

Barbara Müller and Tamas Jakkel explained that FCI is working on it and it's not easy to comply with the new European legislation regarding Data Protection (GDPR).

Review of FCI Judges' fee

The proposal presented to increase the judges' fees was not approved by the majority.

Mrs Class, Mr Pichard and Mr Landarte had a virtual meetings in October. We are in contact with the the board of the Shows Commission and Italian representatives to reschedule the 2021 meeting, since it cannot be held in February due to Covid.

We thank Yves De Clercq and his colleagues from the FCI Thuin office for the way in which our documents were at all times sent promptly and correctly translated to our members; our thanks also go to the FCI General Committee and its representative in our Commission, Mrs Barbara Müller, who supported and defended our proposals.

FCI COMMISSION FOR SIGHTHOUND RACES - Activity report

2020 was an unprecedented year for the international sighthound sports and the strangest year I have ever experienced. We all had high expectations for the magic year 2020 and were looking forward to seeing each other in Tápiószentmárton, Hungary (FCI European Championship - Coursing) and in Helsinki, Finland (FCI European Championship - Racing).

No one would have believed at the beginning of 2020 that our world would change so radically. Last year, when we saw someone wearing a mask in public space, we found that very strange ... this year, when I look at pictures of dog events, everyone wears a mask and we all find this normal. Sadly, this virus still determines our lives completely. We have never lost so much freedom as today. Many events were postponed or cancelled and the core of our sport, the clubs, are facing an enormous loss of income ... due to the lockdowns. As a commission, we tried to be flexible and adjust our calendar as well as possible to the situation. The decision of the FCI concerning the possibility to use only national judges on international events was a big help too.

FCI Championships 2020

Both our 2020 championships were cancelled, together with many CACIL events. Nevertheless, I was happy to see some results of racings and coursings that took place. People are flexible and adjust rapidly to the new sanitary rules.

Meeting of the Commission

The FCI Commission for Sighthound Races has two major priorities:

- Allocation and supervision of the FCI title championships;
- Keeping the 'FCI Regulations for International Sighthound Races and Lure Coursing Events' and the 'FCI International Guidelines for Lure Coursing Judges' up to date.

Traditionally, our meeting is held together with the European Championship Coursing. This year, the meeting took place as a video-meeting on November 21st and 22nd. 20 countries were represented by their delegate, 1 was excused, 3 were absent. This

was the highest number of participating countries in years.

The meeting confirmed the following schedule for the FCI title Championships Coursing and Racing 2021:

- European Championship - Coursing (ECC) 2021: Hungary, Tápiószentmárton – FCI-executive delegate: Slavomira Bozikova (SK)
- European Championship - Racing (WCR) – 2021: Münster, Germany – FCI-executive delegate: Willem Vermaut (BE)

The meeting decided to create a working group for 'championship organisation'. The aim is to update the requirement book, specifications, conditions, terms of acceptance for candidate organisers, the checklist and a model report for the championships' FCI executive delegates.

The working group 'Weight Races' proposed its activity report. Due to the CoVid-19 situation, a lot of events were cancelled and the events that were organised had a very low number of participants. The Commission gave a new mandate to the working group to continue working on weight races and gave permission to organise CdL weight races trials until the CdL meeting of 2022. At that meeting, the working group will propose their evaluation report.

The main topic of our meeting was the 5-yearly update of the 'FCI International Regulations for International Sighthound Races and Lure Coursing Events'. When the Commission decided to start the work on the update of our rulebook, a timeline was set up to get this job done. The Commission chose a participative procedure, which means that there was sufficient time to organise feedback moments with the national organisations, sport commissions and clubs. The updated version of our rulebook has to be ready, approved by the FCI General Committee and translated by January 1st, 2022.

The working group for the 'FCI International Regulations for International Sighthound Races and Lure Coursing Events' did a tremendous job in well preparing a draft to decide on. All initial proposals of the countries were treated by this working group, so the Commission could vote the first time on a draft in

2019. All countries could give feedback on this draft. This feedback was also discussed in the working group and resulted in additional changes and new voting proposals for the 2020 meeting. A final draft will be sent to the FCI beginning of 2021.

To finish, I hope of course for a better future. The CoVid-19 vaccine could be vulnerable intermediate success for a 'new normal'. We all hope that this vaccine will make it possible to organise our events and championships again, and that we will be able to meet each other as we used to do.

FCI COMMISSION FOR EDUCATION AND PUBLIC RELATIONS - *Activity report*

The FCI Commission for Education and Public Relations was established in 2019. The preliminary meeting of the Commission took place on 31 July 2019 in Vilnius, Lithuania. With the presence of the FCI President, Mr Tamas Jakkel, and Commission coordinator on behalf of the FCI General Committee, Mrs Carla Molinari, in addition to 11 delegates of the FCI member countries the Commission discussed, set up and approved its presentation, elected the Board of the Commission and decided on the further actions of the Commission, the initial step being the survey of the FCI member countries on the scope of educational and PR activities respectively carried out by the FCI NCOs locally, the identification of their needs and kind of assistance they would like to have from the FCI, on the basis of which the proposals to the FCI General Committee were prepared and submitted.

Due to the pandemic situation around the world in 2020, the annual online meeting of the FCI Commission for Education and Public Relations took place on 25 November 2020. The Commission approved the minutes of the previous meeting, with minor amendments, and the President's annual report.

Further on, the agenda the FCI Commission for Education and Public Relations had the proposals made to the FCI General Committee, with the underlying comments from the FCI General Committee.

Each proposal and the comments of the FCI General Committee were thoroughly discussed and decisions of further work in the field of education and PR, with reference to what has been done so far, were taken. Discussions were complemented by presentations on breeder education, made by Royal Canin representative Mr Axel Dubois, speaking about Royal Canin's programme Proactive and delegate Mrs Eva Lejdbrandt presenting the breeder education programme conducted by the Swedish national organisation. Furthermore, an elaborate presentation on Dog Day in Finland was made by Mrs Liisa Suoninen, delegate of the Finnish national organisation.

In addition to the delegates of the Commission, the meeting was attended by the FCI PR team, Mr Attila Marton and Mr Gopi Krishnan, and the Commission coordinator on behalf of the FCI General Committee, Mrs Carla Molinari.

On behalf of the Board of the FCI Commission for Education and Public Relations, I would like to thank the Executive Director and the FCI staff for their assistance and good collaboration, and the delegates of the FCI Commission for Education and Public Relations for their work, commitment and fruitful discussions that we had during and in between the meetings of this Commission.

AUDIT REPORT

To the members of the Fédération Cynologique Internationale

In accordance with our letter of engagement dated 29th November 2018 organising the setting up of a programme to examine the accounts of your association, we have the honour of reporting to you on the auditing work that we were asked to carry out.

We have examined the association's accounts to 31/12/2020. This examination carried out in accordance with the auditing and appraisal standards recommended by the Institut des Experts-Comptables & Conseils Fiscaux (I.E.C. – Institute of Chartered Accountants and Tax Consultants), comprises all of the verification surveys and processes that we deemed to be appropriate in the circumstances. These professional standards require that our examination should be organised and carried out in the form of a limited review, and in such a way as to acquire a reasonable assurance that the accounts do not include any significant inaccuracies given the relevant legal and regulatory provisions applicable in Belgium. Within this framework, your association's responsible officers and the accounts department in particular have provided us with full explanations and all of the documents required in order to complete our engagement successfully.

Our conclusions are as follows:

Within the context of the investigations carried out, we found that:

- The administrative organisation and internal control put into place are appropriate to the size and scope of the association's activities.
- The accounts are kept in accordance with the legal and regulatory provisions applicable in Belgium to non-profit-making associations, international non-profit-making associations and foundations.

In addition to this, we have not detected or become aware of any operations concluded or decisions taken in breach of either the Statutes or the relevant applicable legislation.

We have not become aware of any events that have taken place subsequent to the audits carried out which might be likely to have a significant impact upon the accounts and thus to alter these conclusions.

At the end of our work involving examining the accounts, carried out in the form of a limited review, in accordance with the auditing and appraisal standards set out above, we have acquired a reasonable assurance that the accounting statement to 31st December 2020, on which the balance sheet total amounts to **€5,136,340.68** and where the profit and loss account shows a loss to be appropriated of **€447,239.63** gives a true and accurate picture of the association's assets, financial position and results, in accordance with the legal accounting standards applicable in Belgium.

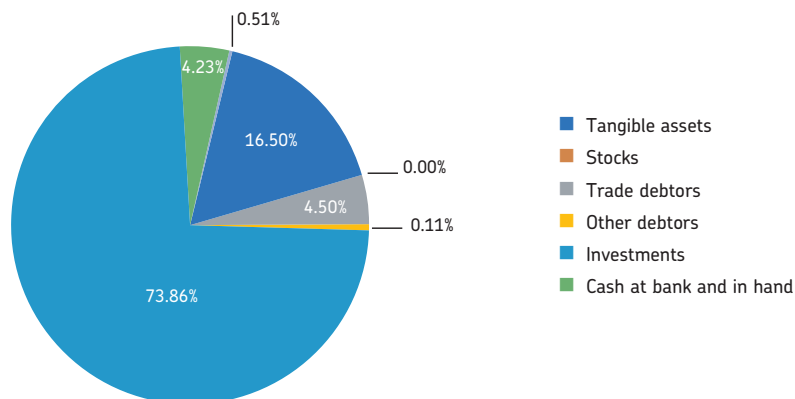

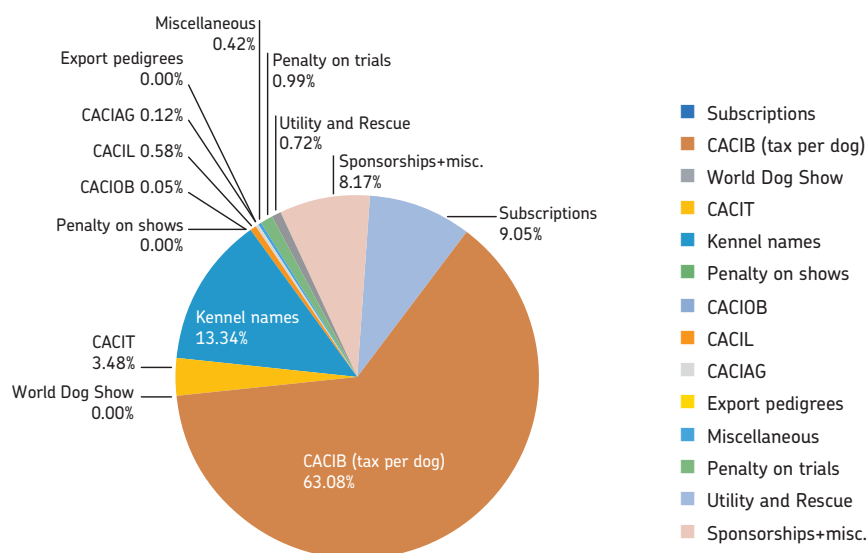

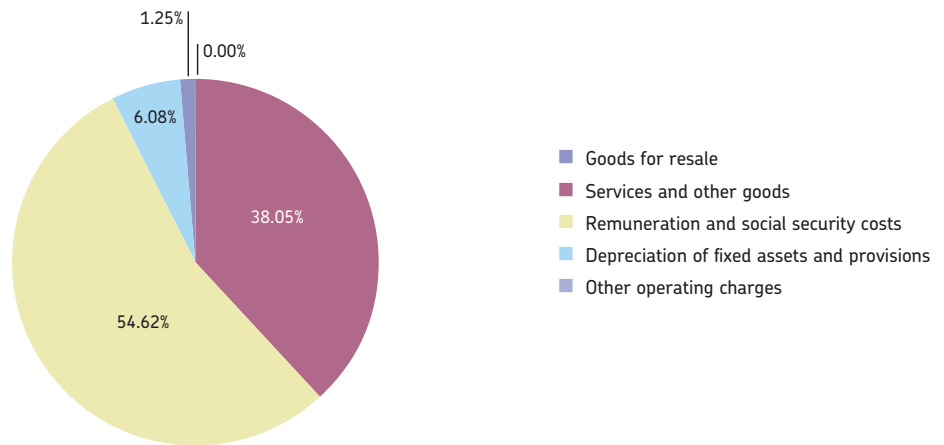
Profit and loss account

PROFIT AND LOSS ACCOUNT

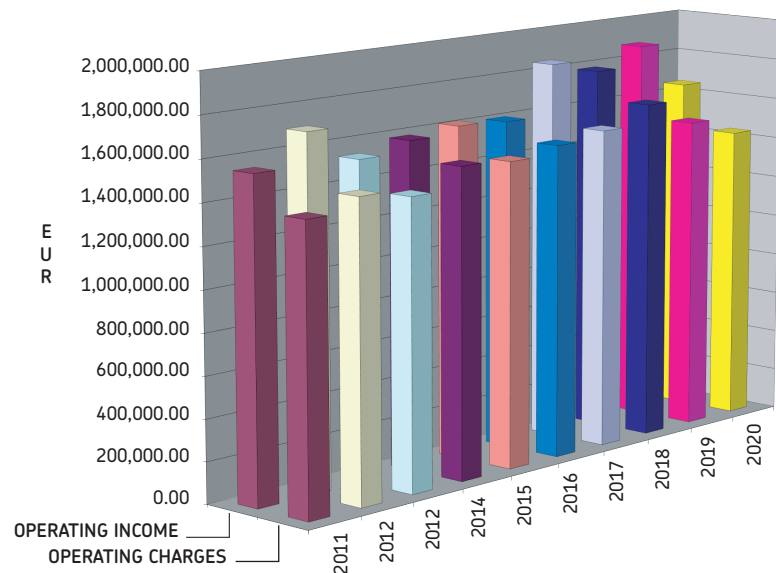




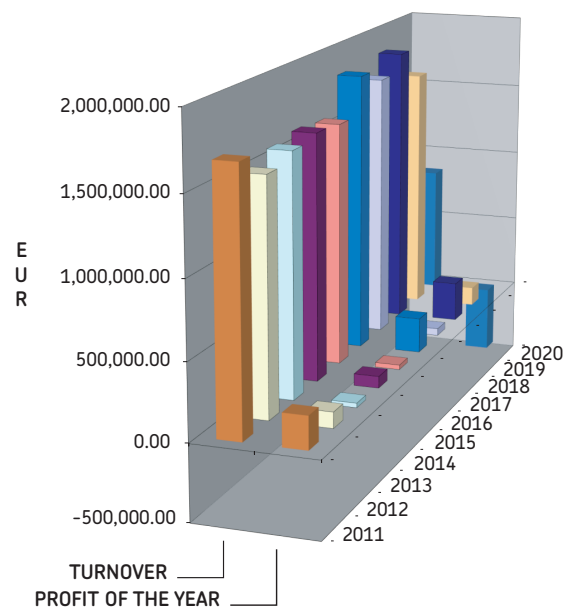
OPERATING CHARGES

Letter of Understanding between FCI and AKC

WHEREAS the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI) and The American Kennel Club (AKC) share the common goals of promoting and protecting purebred dogs ; and

WHEREAS the parties hereto have in the past cooperated to a certain extent in carrying out this object and have been acting pursuant to certain informal agreements made from time to time for that purpose ; and

WHEREAS it is agreed that the relations between AKC and FCI and its member registries should be explicitly written with a view towards future cooperation ;

NOW, this letter of understanding encompasses the mutually agreed to basis for the relationship between the parties as follows :

1. AKC will recognize the pedigree for any FCI registry that meets AKC requirements and that wishes to have such recognition.
2. AKC will not automatically give exclusive recognition to the FCI registry in any country in which there are multiple registries and FCI will not automatically give exclusive recognition to AKC's registry in the United States.
3. AKC will not register any dog born in an FCI member country until that dog has been registered in the Stud Book of the FCI registry or the AKC-recognised registry in that country. No dog born in the USA, belonging to breeds recognised by the AKC, will be registered by an FCI member registry unless the dog has been registered in the FCI-recognised registry in the United States. It is up to the FCI to decide about the registration of dogs born in the USA belonging to breeds not recognised by the AKC.
4. Each of the parties agree that when any information comes to its knowledge which might reasonably affect or be useful to the other party (AKC judges suspension, amended standards, etc.), it will immediately communicate such information to the other party.
5. FCI and AKC will deal with the judging approval reciprocity in a separate document (see attachment).

6. AKC will not sponsor any event in the country of an FCI member without the express permission of FCI and the FCI member. FCI will not sponsor any event within the territory of the United States without the express permission of AKC. Puerto Rico is exempted from this provision as both AKC and FCI have been previously sponsoring activities on that island.
7. While not an FCI member, FCI has graciously agreed to permit AKC to participate in its World or Section Agility, Utility, Obedience, etc. Championship Event provided that this participation does not prevent representative teams of FCI member organisations from taking part. If the AKC teams win the competition, they are not eligible for the title of FCI Winner at these events.
8. AKC registered dogs are eligible for the title of FCI International Champion under specific conditions to be agreed upon by the AKC and FCI.
9. Except with the agreement of the AKC, the FCI will not register kennel names for breeders living in USA (with exception of Puerto Rico) and, except with the agreement of the FCI, the AKC will not register kennel names for breeders living in countries where the FCI has a member, which the AKC has accepted.
10. FCI agrees to send to the AKC headquarters all revised breed standards and AKC agrees to send to the FCI headquarters copies of its Complete Dog Book, which includes all AKC standards, each time that such publication is revised.
11. The terms of this letter of understanding is agreed to by the parties listed below. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon reasonable notification to the other party.

Breed Judging

At FCI CACIB international shows, the AKC judges are eligible to judge and award the CACIB provided that the two following conditions are fulfilled:

1. the breeds they are scheduled to judge are recognised by the AKC (this does not include FSS and Miscellaneous classes).
2. the judges in question are allowed to judge, under AKC regulations, the breeds in question at AKC events and award them championship points. An AKC judge, residing in the United States, may not be approved as an FCI judge (breed, group, all breed) eligible to award CACIB.

At AKC events, the FCI judges are eligible to judge and award championship points provided that the following conditions are fulfilled:

1. the breeds they are scheduled to judge are recognised by the FCI and by the national kennel club, in their country of residence, which has jurisdiction over the judges in question
2. the judges are members of their national kennel club, in their country of residence, which is an FCI member or contract partner
3. the judges in question are allowed to judge, under FCI regulations, the breeds in question at FCI International CACIB shows and award them the CACIB

Group and BIS Judging

It is up to both, the AKC and the FCI members, to choose to invite or not a judge to judge a particular group (according to FCI or AKC breed nomenclature) at an AKC event or at an international FCI CACIB show taking into consideration the experience of the judge, his judging credentials and the breeds and their numbers in the groups to judge.

WHEREAS the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI) and the Kennel Club (KC) share the common goals of promoting and protecting, in the case of the FCI, pedigree dogs and in the case of the Kennel Club, all dogs; and

WHEREAS the parties hereto have in the past cooperated to a certain extent in carrying out this object and have been acting pursuant to certain informal agreements made from time to time for that purpose; and

WHEREAS it is agreed that the relations between KC and FCI and its member registries should be explicitly written with a view towards future cooperation;

NOW, this letter of understanding encompasses the mutually agreed basis for the relationship between the parties as follows:

1. The KC, where it recognises the breed in question, will recognise the pedigree of any FCI registry that meets KC requirements and that wishes to have such recognition.
2. In so far as it is lawful, the KC will give exclusive recognition to the FCI registry in any country in which there are multiple registries provided that these registries meet KC requirements and the FCI will give exclusive recognition to the KC's registry in the United Kingdom. For the time being this will not include Malta and China.
3. The KC will not register any dog, or issue a pedigree to any dog, born in an FCI member country whose registry the KC recognises, until that dog has been registered in the FCI registry in that country. No dog born in the UK will be registered, or have a pedigree issued, by an FCI member registry unless the dog has been registered by the KC in the United Kingdom.
4. Each of the parties agree that when any information comes to its knowledge which might reasonably affect or be useful to the other party (KC or FCI judges suspension, amended standards, etc.), it will immediately communicate such information to the other party.
5. The FCI and the KC will endeavour to agree on the conditions to make their respective judges eligible to officiate at events sanctioned by them (FCI and KC).
6. The KC will not sponsor or support any event for dogs in the country of a current FCI member without the express permission of the FCI member. The FCI will not sponsor or support any event for dogs within the territory of the United Kingdom without the express permission of the KC. For the time being this will not include Malta and China.




7. While the KC is not an FCI member, the FCI has graciously agreed to permit the KC to participate in its World or Section Agility, Utility, Obedience, etc. Championship Event provided that this participation does not prevent representative teams of FCI member organisations from taking part. The KC teams may win the competition but are not eligible for the title of FCI Winner at these events.
8. The FCI agrees to send to the KC headquarters all revised breed standards and the KC agrees to send to the FCI headquarters copies of all revised breed standards. The FCI and KC will discuss health issues connected with breed standards on a regular basis.
9. FCI members are allowed to refer to the title of UK Champion by using the abbreviation "UK Ch + name of the dog".
10. Except with the agreement of the KC, the FCI will not register kennel names of breeders living in the UK and, except with the agreement of the FCI, the KC will not register kennel names of breeders living in countries where the FCI has a member, which the KC has accepted.
11. The terms of this letter of understanding are agreed to by the parties listed below. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon reasonable notification to the other party.





**AGREEMENT ON THE MUTUAL RECOGNITION OF DOG SHOW JUDGES
BETWEEN THE KENNEL CLUB AND THE
FEDERATION CYNOLOGIQUE INTERNATIONALE**

This agreement refers only to the mutual recognition of judges, hereinafter referred to as 'FCI Judges' who are resident in a FCI member country and are listed as designated 'International Judges' in the Judges Directory published by the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI), to award Challenge Certificates and to judge Groups and Best in Show at Kennel Club licensed Championship Shows, and for UK resident judges to award Certificats d'Aptitude au Championnat International de Beauté (CACIBs) and to judge Groups and Best in Show at International FCI CACIB Shows held under the auspices of the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI). Furthermore, all other recognised canine activities such as competitive obedience, agility, field trials, working trials etc. are specifically excluded.

1. This agreement will commence on the 1st day of May in 2017 and will be valid for a period of not more than 5 years, subject to the right of termination by one or other of the parties, no less than six months prior to the date of expiry.
2. Subject to six months' notice, this agreement may be amended at any time by mutual agreement of the parties concerned.
3. This agreement is predicated on the basis that the Kennel Club (KC) and Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI) have agreed to recognise and respect their respective schemes for the approval, education and training of dog show judges.

Approval to award Kennel Club Challenge Certificates

4. The Kennel Club will accept nominations for approval, in accordance with Kennel Club Rules and Regulations and appropriate Codes of Best Practice as published and amended from time to time, to award Challenge Certificates to a breed(s) for the first time, without requesting completion of a Kennel Club questionnaire, for FCI Judges resident in a FCI member country provided they are suitably experienced, having previously awarded CACIBs to the relevant breed(s) in countries other than their country of residence for a minimum period of 5 years prior to their first UK appointment for the breed(s).
5. All such nominations will continue to be subject to the approval of the Kennel Club's Board.



6. FCI Judges resident in a FCI member country who are approved to award Challenge Certificates to a breed for the first time on the basis of mutual recognition may be subject to evaluation when carrying out the appointment. Approval for subsequent appointments to award Challenge Certificates for the same breed will be subject both to the outcome of any evaluation and the proviso that the judge remains in good standing.

7. FCI Judges resident in a FCI member country who were previously approved to award Challenge Certificates at Kennel Club licensed Championship Shows prior to the signing of this agreement will continue to be considered for approval for subsequent appointments, subject to the proviso that they remain in good standing.

Approval to judge Groups and Best in Show at Kennel Club Licensed Championship Shows

8. FCI Judges resident in a FCI member country who were previously approved to judge Groups and Best in Show at Kennel Club licensed Championship Shows prior to the signing of this agreement will continue to be considered for subsequent appointments, subject to the proviso that they remain in good standing.

9. The criteria to be applied in the case of FCI Judges resident in a FCI member country who are nominated, subsequent to the signing of this agreement, to judge Groups and Best in Show for the first time at Kennel Club licensed Championship Shows will be the same as those applicable to UK resident judges.

10. All such nominations will continue to be subject to the approval of the Kennel Club's Board.

Approval to award Fédération Cynologique Internationale Certificat d'Aptitude au Championnat International de Beauté (CACIBs)

11. UK resident judges who remain in good standing and have previously awarded Challenge Certificates in the UK will be eligible to award CACIBs to the relevant breeds provided that they are suitably experienced.

Approval to judge Groups at International FCI CACIB Shows

12. UK resident judges who have previously been approved to award Challenge Certificates in 50% or more of the breeds that are allocated Challenge Certificates by the Kennel Club, in an FCI group, will be eligible to be approved to judge the relevant group at International FCI CACIB Shows, subject to the proviso that they remain in good standing.

13. UK resident judges who remain in good standing and were previously approved, prior to the signing of this agreement, to judge one or more Groups at International FCI CACIB Shows will continue to be recognised as approved to judge the relevant group(s).



Approval to judge Best in Show at International FCI CACIB Shows

14. UK resident judges who remain in good standing and have judged five or more FCI groups will be eligible to be approved to judge Best in Show at International FCI CACIB Shows.


15. UK resident judges who remain in good standing and were previously approved to judge Best in Show at International FCI CACIB Shows prior to the signing of this agreement will continue to be recognised by the FCI as approved to judge Best in Show.

Memorandum of Understanding between FCI and CKC

WHEREAS the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI) and The Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) share the common goals of promoting and protecting purebred dogs;

WHEREAS the CKC and the FCI have, in the past, cooperated to a certain extent in carrying out these goals and have been acting pursuant to certain informal agreements made from time to time for that purpose;

WHEREAS it is recognized that both the FCI and the CKC are required to operate within the limits of the legislation governing their activities, including their respective constitution and by-laws;

NOW this letter of understanding expresses a mutually agreed to basis for the relationship between the CKC and the FCI as follows:

1. The CKC acknowledges the role of the FCI and its governing institutions as set out in the FCI Statutes as the primary world federation of dog registries.
2. The FCI acknowledges the CKC as the primary kennel club in Canada.
3. The CKC and the FCI agree that when any information comes to the knowledge of one party, which might reasonably affect or be useful to the other party (judges suspension, amended standards etc.), it will immediately communicate, in writing, such information to the other party.
4. The parties will meet at the request of either of them, within a reasonable timeframe and on basis of a consistent mutually agreed agenda which will include matters of common interest.



CHAPTER XII - LIST OF CLUBS WITH AN FCI CONTRACT

5. The FCI agrees to send to the CKC head office a copy of all breed standards with revisions as they occur and CKC agrees to send to the FCI headquarters all CKC breed standards with revision as they occur. The FCI and CKC will also share information concerning the decisions of their respective governing bodies such as the exchange of official publications.
6. The CKC will periodically provide the FCI with a list of the registries from the FCI member countries with which the CKC has reached an agreement providing for the mutual recognition of studbooks and pedigrees. The CKC will get in touch with all the FCI members and contract partners and inform them about the procedure to follow to gain CKC recognition. The FCI will notify the CKC of the accession of any country to FCI membership.
7. The details of a mutual recognition of FCI and CKC judges are written on a document which is part of this contract.
8. The FCI will not sponsor or sanction any event within Canada without the express permission of the CKC.
9. The CKC will not sponsor or sanction any event in an FCI member country without the express permission of the FCI and the agreement of the member country.
10. While not an FCI member, FCI graciously agrees to permit CKC to participate in its World or Section Agility, Utility, and Obedience Championship Events and any forthcoming canine performance event that may be mutually recognized by both organizations.
11. As long as no agreement is reached with regard to the working breeds (according to the FCI nomenclature) between the FCI and CKC, these breeds (CKC-registered dogs) are not eligible for the title of "International Beauty Champion". The non-working breeds (CKC-registered dogs) are eligible for this title provided that they comply with the FCI International Championship Regulations, i.e. 4 CACIB in 3 countries under 3 different FCI judges.
12. The CKC registered dogs are eligible for the other FCI international titles provided that they meet with the FCI requirements.
13. The FCI international directory of kennel names (affixes) is not open to CKC breeders and the FCI cannot guarantee that a CKC kennel name (affix) will not be similar to an FCI registered kennel name (affix) and conversely.




- 14. Both parties agree that the present Letter of Understanding shall not be interpreted or applied so as to require either party to act in a manner not authorized by or contrary to applicable legislation, including each party's constitution, rules or by-laws.
- 15. The terms of this Letter of Understanding are agreed to by both parties. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon giving the other party 60 days notice in writing.

CKC Judges eligibility to officiate at FCI International Events

From April 1st, 2009, the following dispositions will apply:

- a) CKC judges are allowed to judge in the FCI member countries all-breed, group and specialty national shows, the breeds they are approved to judge in Canada.
- b) CKC judges who have already judged international FCI CACIB shows before December 31st, 2007, are allowed to award CACIB at international FCI CACIB shows, FCI World and Sections shows, to the breeds they are approved to judge in Canada.
- c) Once a CKC judge has judged four (4) national shows in four (4) different FCI member countries by the FCI breed standards, he/she is allowed to award CACIB to the breeds he/she is approved to judge in Canada.

It will be the responsibility of the FCI Office and of the judges concerned to keep track of assignments undertaken in an FCI member country. Taking into account the legal restrictions on the exercise of extra-territorial jurisdiction by the CKC, it will be the responsibility of the CKC to communicate them to their judges and the practical implementation and enforcement of the agreed above principles will be under the responsibility of the FCI Office, of the FCI members and the judges concerned.
