MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



The world of pedigree dog breeding continues to stand at a crossroads. The challenges we face today are not isolated incidents but part of a broader movement that has the potential to shape the future of our activity worldwide. As history has shown, trends in legislation, social attitudes, and public narratives do not remain confined to one continent—they travel, evolve, and eventually impact us all.

In 2024, anti-breeding propaganda remained a persistent challenge, testing the resilience and unity of our National Canine Organisations. What we witness today in Europe will undoubtedly influence other regions in the coming years. Our collective responsibility is to stay ahead, be prepared, and ensure that the truth about pedigree dog breeding is defended and communicated effectively.

A crucial milestone of this year was the progress of a new EU-level legislation on dog and cat welfare. Such regulations, once enacted, will inevitably affect our work—not only in Europe but across the globe. The FCI did not stand idle. We actively engaged in diplomatic efforts, ensuring that the voices of our National Canine Organisations and the expertise of the FCI Scientific Commission were considered in shaping official reactions. Strengthening our connections with the relevant EU Commission representatives was not just a necessity but a strategic move that will serve as the foundation for future dialogues and advocacy.

In line with our commitment to science-based and responsible dog breeding, we took a significant step forward by joining the "Choose Health" roundtable at the end of the year. This coalition, which brings together animal welfare organisations and EU decision-makers, marks a significant opportunity to ensure that canine health and breeding discussions include factual, well-researched perspectives rather than emotionally driven narratives.

Looking ahead, our mission remains clear. The events of this year have reinforced the need for both collective efforts and individual initiatives at the national level. Engaging with decision-makers, emphasizing the importance and benefits of our work, and ensuring that legislation is guided by expertise rather than misconception are priorities that we must all embrace.

Unity, knowledge, and determination will define our success. Our passion for pedigree dogs is not just a personal pursuit—it is a commitment to society, responsible breeding, and preserving history and tradition. We must stand firm in our mission, prepared for what lies ahead.

Thank you to all National Canine Organisations, our partners, the FCI General Committee, and every individual dedicated to preserving and promoting pedigree dog breeding—your work matters, now more than ever.

MISSION STATEMENT

Introduction

Established in 1911, the FCI includes 98 Members and Contract Partners (one member per country). Each Member issues their own pedigrees and train highly-qualified judges. The FCI makes sure that the pedigrees and judges are mutually recognised by all the FCI members, Contract Partners and any person involved in their domestic canine scene.

In accordance with the celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the Fédération Cynologique Internationale, the FCI General Committee reviewed its Mission, Vision Statement and Values to maintain the Association's leadership worldwide.

In 2018, further to the decision of the FCI Extraordinary General Assembly, FCI's Mission, Vision Statements and Values were revised as follows:

Mission and Vision statement

The FCI is the highest authority of the canine culture and supports, via its Members and Contract Partners, the well-being of pedigree dogs worldwide as well as their selective breeding and generational registrations. The FCI is responsible for safeguarding pedigree dogs' health and international pedigree dog activities to en-

hance the relations between dogs and humans. The FCI recognises that the following principles and professional responsibilities are fundamental for the well-being of all pedigree dogs worldwide:

Valuos

- a/ The FCI considers pedigree dogs' health, temperament and behaviour of utmost importance in Breed Standards.
- b/ The FCI promotes pedigree dogs' activities and sports worldwide, which it considers beneficial for the pedigree dogs.
- c/ The FCI entrusts its commissions to make recommendations about other important matters.
- d/ The FCI divides geographically the world of pedigree dogs through its three (3) sections.
- e/ The FCI trusts its Members and Contract Partners to protect the integrity of their National Registries.
- f/ The FCI recognises and respects agreements with non-member national organisations.
- g/ The FCI sets the highest standards for its Head Office.
- h/ The FCI ensures the regular celebration of World and Section Championship events.

Introduction

La FCI a été fondée en 1911 et compte 98 Membres et Partenaires sous Contrat (un membre par pays). Chaque Membre émet ses propres pedigrees et forme des juges de manifestations canines hautement qualifiés. Die FCI wurde in 1911 gegründet und hat 98 Mitglieder und Vertragspartner (ein Mitglied pro Land). Jedes Mitglied erstellt seine eigenen Ahnentafeln und bildet hochqualifizierte Richter aus. Die FCI stellt sicher, dass die Ahnentafeln und Richter innerhalb der FCI von allen Mitgliedern, Vertragspartnern und allen in der Hundeszene tätigen Personen anerkannt werden.

Im Rahmen des 100-jährigen Jubileums der Fédération Cynologique Internationale hat der FCI-Vorstand seine Mission-Statement und seine Vision-Statement sowie die Werte überarbeitet um die weltweite Führungsposition der Vereinigung in der Kynologie zu erhalten.

In 2018 wurden nach Beschluss der Außerordentlichen Generalversammlung der FCI Mission-, Vision- Statement und Werte der FCI wie folgt überarbeitet:

Mission und Vision-statement

Die FCI ist die höchste Autorität für Hundekultur und unterstützt über ihre Mitglieder und Vertragspartner das Wohlergehen von Hunden mit Ahnentafel weltweit sowie ihre selektive Zucht und genealogische Registrierung.

- f/ Die FCI anerkennt und respektiert Abkommen mit nationalen Hundeverbänden, die keine FCI-Mitglieder sind.
- g/ Für ihre Geschäftsstelle setzt sie höchste Maßstäbe.
- h/ Die FCI sorgt für die regelmäßige Durchführung von Championaten auf Welt- und Sektionsebene.


EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- September: announcement of the revival of the FCI World Challenge (of Top Dogs) that will take place in Helsinki (August 2025) in the frame of the FCI World Dog Show.
- November: the FCI (President, Executive Director) take part in a round table "Choose Health: Together let's create a better future for cats and dogs" organised by our Partner, Royal Canin, in Brussels. The primary purpose of the roundtable is to discuss the ways in which attending parties could rally to drive actions and influence positive changes around the extreme and unethical breeding of cats and dogs.

Several FCI commissions also held different seminars, physical or online, for their specialised judges in order to keep them familiar with the amended regulations (Rescue Dogs-Herding-Obedience, etc.).

To end up, let me express my warmest thanks to the FCI General Committee members, the FCI Members and Contract Partners, to all the presidents of the FCI commissions and to our devoted FCI Staff for their efficient cooperation. Special thanks are also conveyed to Royal Canin and their very dedicated and committed team.



FCI STANDARDS COMMISSION

Activity report

We had held our annual Standards Commission meeting at Timisoara, Romania on May 13th, 2024.-

The Standard Commission main work continues being to revise and adapt new and existing standards. Standards are always in continue evolution for different reasons, for new rules on the countries of origin, simple reality of the breed, evolution or making better wording, etc. but mostly focus on dog's health, countries review the text in standards extra carefully to avoid wording that may result in interpretation that can lead to exaggerations that might cause health risks in the dogs, not forgetting to take special care to maintain always the type of the breeds.

The Commission thoroughly revises and amends standards continuously and the co-operation with the National Organizations is usually efficient. Still, the procedure must go through several steps before a standard can be changed and published, these documents are the backbone in the work of the FCI and its member countries.

Viewing of the text in standards from a health and welfare perspective has been intensified. This is not



always about the wish of the countries of origin but, in the interest of keeping the breeds for the future, we all must realise that exaggerations in type as well as character issues in dogs might not only affect the health of the dogs, but it may also increase the risk to have breeds banned by law in some countries.

We had marked a working method within the commission; how to manage the standards since they arrive to the office until they are seen and discussed by the commission, then send back to the Country of Origin for acceptance and then to General Committee for their approval to be latter published.

We do insist on asking to the National Organizations collaboration on having a representative good drawing or picture to illustrate the front page of the FCI Standards as this will help a lot the comprehension of the hole standard, also we ask them to try to publish the commented standard on the FCI web page, https://www.fci.be/en/Nomenclature/Education.aspx with photos and video for the people and

judges to understand better and in a more graphic way the breeds.

New breeds presented for provisional recognition on this meeting:

All these breeds had been studied and are in different stages of the required processes.

The FCI Scientific Commission is one of the three compulsory commissions of the FCI; it is composed of six members elected by the FCI General Assembly.

To have an official character, all decisions made by the commission must be approved by the FCI General Committee.

The Scientific Commission is headed by a president, elected by the members of the commission, which also appoints a secretary among its members.

The Scientific Commission is assigned four main tasks:

- 1 To support guidelines on pedigree dog breeding, based on scientific evidence and experience in the field.
- 2 Reviewing and proposing amendments to the FCI International Breeding Regulations
- 3 To inform the FCI about new scientific discoveries which have an impact on breeds
- 4 To provide recommendations on the recognition of new breeds.

The Scientific Commission holds a physical meeting annually, together with the Standards Commission. In addition, the Commission has online meetings every two months.

sends the minutes of the meetings to the FCI Central Office and to all the delegates of the commission. Then, their approval is requested by the delegates on the occasion of the next meeting.

The FCI Scientific Commission, held its annual meeting in Timişoara, Romania, on May 13, 2024 and was attended by FCI President Dr. Tamas Jakkel. Where several important topics were discussed, likewise the main objective of this commission was emphasized:

- 5. 2 articles were developed: "Position of the FCI Scientific Commission on the use of genomic tools" and "Breeding systems and canine health and welfare. Position of the FCI Scientific Commission" on the breeding of purebred dogs based on scientific evidence and proven experience; to this end, approaches are being made to the FCI Health and Welfare Commission and the FCI Breeding Commission.
- 6. Breeding system welfare/health of dogs; a review of studies on the impact of purchasing puppies from kennels that are registered with the FCI is being carried out.
- 7. Discussion of the importance of breeding with certain coat colors, as well as the double Merle.
- 8. Revision of the guidelines on crossbreeding is also underway.

Activity report

COMMISSION MEETINGS

The FCI Agility Committee had 2 meetings in the year 2024 with the delegates of the kennel clubs that are a member of the FCI and our partner organizations.

The first meeting was held on the 3rd and 4th of February in Brussels (Belgium). Our second meeting was held on October the 7th, the day after the FCI Agility World Championship, in Opglabbeek (Belgium).

In 2024, we made several changes to the Specifications for the FCI Agility World Championship. One of these was the removal of the official training, to improve on the duration of the schedule. Another was the addition of a section about the responsibilities of the judges who are judging this prestigious event.

The committee also created several working groups, amongst others:

- A working group to watch over the youth agility event of 2024 and make sure the kids have a positive experience. They will focus on helping young handlers manage competition pressure, keeping things fun and balanced, and making sure the kids and their dogs work well together in a safe and supportive environment
- Course design working group that will look into all aspects of Agility Course design.
- Working group Camera Systems Integration to investigate everything around the implementation of a "VAR" system.

Next to all of this, the committee decided also:

- that Italy will be the host of the 2027 FCI Agility World Championships
- to increase the number of reserve dogs from one per category to two
- to create a working group to watch over the youth agility event of 2024 and make sure the kids have a positive experience. They will focus on helping young handlers manage competition pressure, keeping things fun and balanced, and making sure the kids and their dogs

- work well together in a safe and supportive environment
- to align the fee of Agility judges with that of the show judges.

At the end of November / beginning of December the FCI Agility Committee organized a judges workshop with the help of the French Kennelclub. Every country was able to send 2 judges and over 30 in total attended the workshop. The judges discussed agility rules and guidelines and participated in workshops course building (via baseline system), practical judging and measuring dogs (with a short introduction to measuring the ULNA).

EVENTS

■ Junior Open Aqility World Championship (JOAWC)

The world championship for handlers under 19 years of age was held in Opglabbeek (Belgium) from the 18th of July until the 21st. The location was Sentower Park, which was already used in 2022 to host the European Open. This year we had over 480 competitors and we see that even though this is a popular event it is getting increasingly more difficult to find hosts willing to organize it.

Activity report




On March 17th, the FCI British Pointer Committee held a meeting in Niš, Serbia. Important issues, such as the international CACIT competition calendar were discussed, so that all countries can hold competitions with the greatest possible success.





The Committee is responsible for the most important British Pointing Dogs' competition, the European Cup. For this reason disscussions were made about the country where the next Cup will be held. Furthermore changes of the regulations were thoroughly analyzed, and judges were appointed.

On March 18th-19th, the European Cup was held in Niš with complete success in ideal terrain for the type of competition. Best dog was declared the Pointer Alice Tacinis whose handler was Mr. Manolakis, owner was Mr. Botsoglou and breeder Mr. Ristic, while after a tie the winning countries were Italy and the Czech Republic. The next meeting was set on February the 7th in Jerez de la Frontera, where the next European Cup will be held.



Commission Meetings

The first meeting of the commission for Canicross & Turnierhundsport was held on August 24th as an online meeting. During this meeting Martin Schlockermann from Germany was elected as the president of this group.

During an information exchange about Canicross & Turnierhundsport representatives of Germany, Austria, Hungary, France, Turkey and Sweden, explained the current situation and activities in their country. Canicross is well known in all these countries and becomes more and more popular. Turnierhundsport is only known in Germany and Austria. Therefore Martin Schlockermann gave a presentation which parts in Germany belong to

Turnierhundsport and how to handle it.

First it is necessary to get from all countries, of this commission, their valid rules. It is necessary to find a solution, because it seems to be, that all countries have different rules and are now not compatible. So all countries send their rules to create a table to show where deviations are and how adjustments could be made. The aim should be, to have a base, all could work on and at the next meeting to find a solution for all.

Additionally a proposal to measure the dogs in different classes, depending on ULNA-measurement and height was presented. The delegates discussed about the proposal. Even that is done differently in the countries. One idea was to compare the different measurements and proof by measuring the same dogs with the different systems for comparing whether these different measurement methods achieve so different results, that the dogs would be divided into different size classes. If so, it should be necessary to find one system all will follow.

THE FCI COMMISSION FOR EDUCATION AND PUBLIC RELATIONS

Activity report



The FCI Commission for Education and Public Relations convened on 13 May 2024 in Antalya, Turkey, for its annual meeting to review the year's progress, address current challenges, and strategize future initiatives.

In the morning, before the official meeting, the FCI Commission's for Education and Public Relations delegates had a meeting with the FCI General Committee members Ms. Ilaria Biondi de Ciabatti, Ms. Barbara Muller, and Mr. Jose Miguel Doval Sanchez, and the representative of the FCI European Section Mr. Laurent Pichard. The primary objective of the meeting was to present the Commission's vision and direction and engage in a productive discussion regarding the FCI's expectations for the Commission's work moving forward. The conversation was both constructive and fruitful and served as grounds for the Commission's decisions taken during its meeting later on the same day.

The meeting with the FCI General Committee members was followed by the official meeting of the FCI Commission for Education and Public Relations. The meeting brought together delegates from six countries: Finland, Lithuania, Malaysia, Sweden, the Netherlands, and Turkey. It was also attended by a commission coordinator on behalf of the FCI General Committee and three guests.

The Commission's president, Ms. Ramune Kazlauskaite, led the meeting, with Ms. Daiva Kvedariene serving as secretary and minutes writer.

The Commission's delegates approved the annual report presented by its President, Ms. Ramune Kazlauskaite.

The Commission addressed the proposal for the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on the welfare of dogs and cats and their traceability (2023/0447), particularly its potential impact on registered breeding and dog shows. Furthermore, the delegates discussed the Commission's further steps and proposals to the FCI General Committee, taking into account the insights and ideas shared during the meeting with the members of the FCI General Committee.

It was decided to collect and share best practices for engaging the public during dog shows, with an emphasis on creating meaningful connections between breeders and attendees. Also, it was agreed to share the NCOs' practices for celebrating Dog Day, emphasizing its role in promoting the values of responsible dog ownership and purebred breeding. Finally, the decision was taken to enhance the repository of the resources for breeder and general public education, ensuring they are easily accessible to NCOs through FCI's technical support.

Chapter VII - Our commissions



It was also established that the Commission's next meeting will be held in Madrid, Spain, on March 29-30, 2025.

The Commission sent the first set of materials to the FCI office in November 2024, and they were approved by the FCI General Committee.

The FCI Commission for Education and Public Relations remains committed to advancing education, public awareness, and promoting cynological values globally. By fostering collaboration among member countries and engaging with the public, the Commission aims to uphold the FCI's mission of promoting responsible dog breeding and ownership.

FCI COMMISSION FLYBALL

Activity report

The year 2024 proved to be another exciting chapter for the FCI Flyball Commission. Building upon the momentum of previous years, the sport continued to thrive, showcasing a remarkable level of athleticism and sportsmanship. The pinnacle of the year was undoubtedly the Flyball Open World Cup (FOWC), an event that solidified Europe's growing dominance in the flyball world.

The 2024 FOWC, hosted in Alsfeld, Germany, from 31st May to 2nd June, was a spectacular display of flyball talent. Organized by a dedicated team comprising HundesportLich e.V., Flyball Oberfranken e.V., Hundesportverein Harthausen e.V., and members of the Quickstep teams, the event unfolded within the magnificent Hessenhalle.

Three competition rings ensured a smooth flow for the 75 participating teams, representing 10 European nations. While the late announcement of the tournament unfortunately precluded participation from teams outside Europe, the European contingent more than made up for it.

Until a decade ago, North American teams always dominated the top rankings of fastest flyball times in the world. However, a remarkable shift has occurred. Currently, 6 out of the top 10 fastest times all time belong to European teams. This

trend culminated in 2024 with the Belgian team, RoadRunners Beep Beep, achieving an unprecedented world record of 14.07 seconds.

The FOWC itself was a thrilling competition with intense rivalry among top teams and as the tournament drew to a close,

it was the UK and Belgium who emerged as the frontrunners, set to battle it out for the championship. The final showdown saw two Belgian teams, The Green Angels and the record-breaking RoadRunners Beep Beep, vying for the title. In a decisive victory, RoadRunners Beep Beep successfully defended their 2022 world championship.

The FOWC provided also a valuable platform for international collaboration. A dedicated meeting brought together members of the FCI Flyball Commission, along with key representatives from the UK and Poland, to address crucial issues. The primary focus of the discussions centered around the need for greater uniformity in international flyball regulations. Recognizing the existing discrepancies between rules in different countries, participants emphasized the importance of establishing a more standardized set of guidelines.

The FOWC showcased the exceptional talent within the European flyball community, while the concerted efforts towards international rule unification laid the foundation for a more cohesive and unified future for the sport.

The commission extends its sincere gratitude to its members, the dedicated organizing committee of the FOWC, and the VDH for their invaluable contributions in making 2024 a resounding success.

The commission is committed to building upon these achievements in the coming year. In the meantime, we can also announce that the next FOWC 2026 will be held in England and we hope to welcome teams from other continents as well.

FCI OBEDIENCE COMMISSION

Activity report

2024 was a very active year in the FCI Commission for Obedience. First of all we had two meetings: an online meeting in April and an in-person meeting after our World Championship in Riga/Latvia in July. Beside this we had an international judges meeting in the beginning of November in the lovely Italian city of Naples.

In the online meeting in April we fixed up small changes and clarifications in our rules from 2022, which had been necessary due to some ambiguities (are effective since 1st January 2025), and we clarified questions about the World Championship 2024 in Latvia.

In the in-person meeting in July in Riga we decided the last small changes in our rules and we fixed up the judges and locations for the next FCI Obedience World Championships, which will be held in Norway (2025) and Sweden (2026). Further we started to discuss the revision of

the Regulations for FCI Obedience World Championships, which need to get an update (will be effective from 1st January 2026), and therefore we made the first decisions (e.g. in the future we will increase the number of participants from 100 to 120). In addition to the themes above we got some preinformations about the international judges meeting in November in Naples/Italy and for sure a review to the World Championship 2024 in Riqa/Latvia. The reports of both events you can find below. Thanks to Ton Hoffmann (Chief Judge WWCh 2024), Vladislava Akimova (Latvian Delegate) and Hanspeter Jutzi (Vicepresident of the commission).

In the name of the FCI Commission for Obedience I want to give very special thanks to the Latvian Kennel Club (LKF) and all persons who were involved for arranging WWCh 2024 and the in-person meeting of our commission. We were really feeling very well through the whole days

in the wunderful city of Riga. A further special thank I want to give to the Italian Kennel Club (ENCI) and their organizers for arranging the international judges meeting in November in Naples, which had also had a very nice reverberation.

We all in the commission are looking forward to a very interesting year 2025 hoping to meet us again in two online meetings in January and April and at the FCI Obedience World Championship 2025, combined with our in-person meeting in Sandefjord, Norway, at the beginning of July.

Our goal is to finish the revision of the Regulations for FCI Obedience World Championships, so that they can be introduced by 1st January 2026. FCI Obedience World Championship 2024

Date: 25th till 28th of July 2024 Place: Riga (Latvia)

WEDNESDAY 24TH

I arrived on Tuesday 23th July in Riga. On Wednesday we went to the competition field to explore the situation and meet all volunteers. From 13:00 the volunteers started to build up the ring and the ringstewards were preparing the ring. It was amazing, that they did it in a short time, so you could recognise that they were very well prepared. Also the President of the Latvian Kennel Club (LKF), Mrs. Vija Klučniece, was present to welcome us. The other judges arrived also on this day, so there was time to meet each other.

THURSDAY 25TH

The first official day of the competition started with vet-check, registration and the judges meeting with the stewards. At 11:00 the official opening was announced and all teams from 23 countries came into the ring with their national flags. After the opening speech from Mrs. Vija Klučniece, a group of four Cheerleaders did a performance. After this, a group of four man and woman performed a traditional Latvian dance in Latvian costumes. Very special, I can't remember that we had this before in a World Champi-

onship. The Latvian national anthem was played and the World Championship 2024 was declared for open.

At 13:00 the group exercises started and this took time till the end of the day. This was with 19 groups of 5 teams a warming up for the four judges. At the end of the day the white dog was performing the individual exercises. At the end of the day we had the judges meeting and the teamleader meeting, where all questions were answered and little issues were adjusted and solved.



FRIDAY 26TH

The first day of the individual qualifications, start at 08:00. Therefore the ring was divided in two rings. In the first ring, Pernilla Talberg (FI) and Clemente Grosso (IT) judged the exercises Heelwork, Positions during heelwork, Recall with positions and Sent to circle and square.

In the second ring Vladislava Akimova (LV) and Jan Brücker (GER) judged Scent and retrieve, ex 3.8, better known as Uwe's exercise, Directed retrieve and Distance Control.



I have to explain "Uwe's exercise". Uwe Wehner, the German delegate in the FCI Commission for Obedience, came for several years with the proposal to implement this exercise. In the beginning many countries had huge problems with this and nowadays, everyone likes this exercise.

Till 14:30 it was nice weather, not to sunny, nice temperature for the dogs, but then it became dark, very dark. A little bit rain, but in a few minutes it was a thunderstorm with heavy rain. In English they say "It is raining cats and dogs". For sure we all know how heavy rain could be, but this was unbelievable. In a short time the ring was gone and on the place, only water was on.

However, the judges' individual evaluations were usually not very far apart when it came to awarding qualifications and points.

One of the more important discussion subjects was how to ensure that Obedience competitions become more attractive for recreational dog sports athletes.

The meeting was a great event: a great hotel, good seminar rooms, a beautiful outdoor arena and, last but not least, wonderful weather. Then, for the practical part, a very good steward and dog/handler teams, who worked very well despite the many judges on the field.

For future meetings we will have to think more about the organization of the practical part. More than 12 teams (over 60 rescue dogs) were involved for 14 days and had remarkable achievements, they found both living and deceased people.

The help of each team was appreciated at the highest level by the Turkish government and the Turkish embassy in each participating country, the search-rescue dogs receiving awards and special diplomas.

The media coverage of the activity and results of the rescue dogs, following the earthquake in Turkey, led to greater and varied involvement of the business environment, as sponsors and donors.

The increasingly varied and numerous participation in all rescue specialties, from as many FCI member countries as possible, in the World Championship of Rescue dogs 2023, is a sure indicator of the development of rescue search activity, worldwide.

Today, it is no longer a surprise to see on the podium, at the FCI World Championships, countries that had no tradition in this sport, but have a major interest in the development of this specialty.



An interesting statistic of the FCI recognized dog breeds that are involved in rescue competitions and exams:

- until 2016 more than 32 breeds
- until 2022 more than 40 breeds
- until 2025 more than 50 breeds

The adaptation of the new Regulations for search and rescue dogs in 2024, was another vision of the Commission, that all rescue dogs have a high adaptability coefficient in exams, having as a model the typology of disasters that happened in the areas of the world.

Today we have - Regulation for search and rescue dog, Regulation for search and rescue dogs TEAMS and Open Competition.

2025 - Turkey - FCI WCH Teams

2027 - Romania - FCI WCH Teams

2028 - France - FCI WCH Individual

FCI COMMISSION FOR RETRIEVERS

Activity report

The FCI commission annual meeting took place in Benesov, Czech Republic on th 7th of February 2024, prior to the European Championship. It was a great meeting with delegates of 15 countries present! Also Mr. José M. Doval was present, representing the FCI general committee. It shows how active the working retriever community is and how well the commission is functioning.

Several important topics were discussed, but it was specifically satisfying to completely finalize the updated international field trial regulations. This process was started in 2019 and to see the result after 5 years was another proof of the constructive work delivered by the commission

European Retriever Championship 2023

The 2023 European Retriever Championship was hosted by Czech Republic at the estate around Konopiště castle which is one of the oldest pheasantries in Europe with a fantastic history.

The judges on 8th and 9th of February 2024 where Mr. Les McLean (United Kingdom), Mr. Roddy Forbes (United Kingdom), Mr. Fons Exelmans (Belqium) and Mr. Pieter Vivijs (Belqium).

30 dogs from 14 different countries participated in this historical place. Both days were walked-up with a great variety in the ground with mainly pheasants

On the second day Crazylake Barrique Blue, a black Labrador bred, owned and handled by Hannes Wiesinger from Austria, gave a very nice eye-wipe and afterwards made one of the most challenging retrieves of the whole trial look very easy. This secured his win and was awarded 1st Excellent with CACT/CACIT and European Champion 2023. He made history winning two championships back to back as he also won the European Championship 2022 in Finland, something nobody else has achieved before.



Stef Bollen from Belgium with Int FT Ch De Dee Arlet Star took 2nd place Excellent RCACT/RCACIT and Jan Lorenzen from Denmark with DKJ Ch. Stenhøjgårds Friday was awarded 3ht place Excellent.

International Working Test 2024

The IWT 2024 was organised by the German Retriever Club on 8th and 9th July at Hofgut Appenborn near Rabenau. 43 teams from 16 different FCI member countries took part in the event. Judges Clare Baker (England), David Logan (Scotland), Nigel Probert (Wales), Billy Lundy (Ireland), Betty Schwieren (Germany) and Anja Moeller (Germany) took advantage of the varied grounds to offer the participating teams ten challenging tests over the two days. They were supported by around 70 helpers on the grounds and many more in the behind the scenes organisation, who all did an outstanding job. More than 400 spectators watched the competitions on both days.



The winning team was: Team Denmark 1

Henriette Schausen with DKWTCH Batmoors Premier Burnley Filip Stentoft with 3.RM23 Kela Flemming Nøhr with DKWTCH, DKMTCH Sagnlandet's Glory Zippo.

Second place went to Italy 2 and third place to Finland 3.

European Retriever Championship 2024

The European Retriever Championship 2024 was hosted by Italy in Gambolo. In 2024 two championships took place as the 2023 edition happened very late in the 2023/2024 shooting season, February 2024 in Czech Republic.

The ground that the Italian Retriever Club managed to secure for this event was never used for a field trial before, but everybody agreed that we hope it will not be the last time. This estate has everything to test a gundog. We had two days walking up in every type of ground and cover. The second day started with a duck drive where all the dogs had some challenging water retrieves.

The 2024 European Championship was judged by Stefania Gandolfi (Italy), David Logan (United Kingdom), Declan Boyle (Ireland) and Sefano Martinoli (Italy) and 30 dogs from 13 different countries participated.



The level was high and near the end of the second day, 5 dogs were still very clean. In the last round we sadly lost two dogs, one of them being the winner of the last two editions. A very consistent dog, being so close to the awards again for the third time in a row.

When the judges declared the trial over, 3 dogs were left, only the judges knowing the result.

Finaly they declared Rinus Heijmans from The Netherlands with Int FT Ch. Beautiful Hunter Reeve European Champion 2024 with 1st place Excellent, CACT/CACIT.

Lena Högfeldt from Sweden with Holten's Aurum took 2nd place Excellent with RCACT/RCACIT and Simeon Schmoigl from Austria woth Int FT CHh. Jersey Girls Velvet was awarded 3th place Excellent.

FCI COMMISSION FOR SIGHTHOUND SPORT (CSS)

Activity report

The FCI Sighthound Sport encompasses both lure coursing and racing, each rooted in the sighthound's natural instinct to chase fast-moving prey. Lure coursing evaluates a sighthound's working abilities, including its speed, agility, and ability to track and capture a lure. Racing, on the other hand, measures a sighthound's capacity to compete directly against others, covering a set distance in the shortest possible time. While both disciplines share a common foundation, their organization and participation requirements differ siqnificantly. As a result, the practical application of the shared regulations outlined in the FCI Regulations for International Sighthound Racing and Lure Coursing Events requires distinct approaches for each sport.

Lure Coursing: A Strong and Thriving Discipline

With about 55 international CACIL Lure coursing events in about 20 countries during 2024 lure coursing fosters a thriving international competition scene.

Racing: Overcoming Challenges through Collaboration

Based on the recommendations of the working groups racing and rulebook, the CSS proposed in the second half of 2023 updated regulations for racing. The FCI board promptly approved these regulations, ensuring their implementation as of January 1, 2024. As a result, approximately 30 international CACIL racing events were scheduled on the FCI calendar for 2024 across around 7 countries. On top of that, an official application to organize the FCI World Championship Racing 2025 has been submitted.

Continuous monitoring, evaluation and adaptation

To ensure the continued success of these reforms, the Racing and Rulebook Working Groups will keep in close contact with the clubs and participants to monitor and evaluate the international coursing and racing events. Their findings are submitted to the CSS on a regular base, which will assess the need for any adjustments to further refine the regulations.

Looking Ahead with Confidence

The CSS remains very satisfied with the progress made in 2023 and 2024. With the new regulations, increased collaboration, and a strong commitment to the future of sight-hound sports, the CSS looks forward to an even more dynamic and promising year ahead.

FCI Championships 2024

In 2023, the CSS World Championship Lure Coursing 2024 was initially allocated to Poland. However, despite the significant preparatory work already undertaken, Poland was ultimately compelled to withdraw its candidature due to internal and external challenges. Additionally, as no applications were received for a World Championship Racing event, 2024 passed without a FCI Championship in sighthound sport.

Meetings of the commission

The FCI Commission for Sighthound Sport has 2 major priorities:

- Allocation and supervision of the FCI World Championships Lure Coursing and Racing.
- Keeping the 'FCI Regulations for International Sighthound Races and Lure Coursing Events' and the 'FCI International Guidelines for Lure Coursing Judges' up to date.

In recent years, our commission has grown significantly closer, with a remarkable increase in commitment and involvement from its members. This dedication is reflected in the consistently high attendance numbers, demonstrating a strong sense of engagement.

Chapter VII - Our commissions

To further strengthen this positive development, commission members have expressed a clear interest in being more informed, allowing them to contribute even more effectively. As president, I am very pleased with this progress and deeply appreciate the collective effort that continues to drive our commission forward.

During 2024 the CSS held 2 official and 2 informative video meetings of the CSS:

Official meetings

- on June 5th, 21 out of 23 delegates were present
- on December 2nd, 21 out of 23 delegates were present

Informative meetings

- on February 22nd, 20 out of 23 delegates were present
- on October 10th, 19 out of 23 delegates were present

The main topic of discussion at the official meetings was the organization of the FCI World Championships Coursing and Racing. In 2025, for the first time in many years both championships will be organized again.

The World Championship Lure Coursing will take place in Odry, Czech Republic, in May, followed by the World Championship Racing in Gelsenkirchen, Germany, in September. CSS is delighted that these prestigious events will once again be held and extends already its sincere gratitude to the organizing committees for their dedication and efforts.

Additionally, several minor clarifications to the international rulebook were reviewed and approved to ensure clarity and consistency in regulations.

The following working groups are active to do the necessary preparatory work for the annual CSS meetings:

FCI COMMISSION FOR SLEDGE DOGS

Activity report

The FCI Sledge Dog Commission had its first (digital) meeting in November 2024 since its last physical meeting in Estonia 2018. In 2021 during the Covid period, the commission worked via exchange of email for working breed status of the sledge dog breeds. Only the Greenlanddog - whose standard is under the authority of FCI member Denmark - was granted working breed status. Also the provisional recognized Yakutian Laika, whose standard belongs to Russia, is acknowledged as a working breed.

The standards of the Alaskan Malamute and the Siberian Husky are under the authority of the AKC.

The breed's parent club in the United States does award sled dog titles to dogs that meet qualifying standards in sanctioned sled dog races. However, these titles are not officially recognized as AKC titles because the races are conducted exclusively on snow. The American Kennel Club follows a one-size-fits-all policy that all performance trials should be accessible to participants nationwide, regardless of location or climate. This creates a challenge for sled dog breeds, which have historically lived and worked in cold climates for thousands of years. The requirement for universal accessibility means that trials must be designed in a way that accommodates regions where snow is not available, potentially altering the traditional conditions under which these breeds have been tested for generations. This raises questions about how to fairly evaluate the working abilities of sled dog breeds while maintaining the integrity of their historical function and polar characteristics. Recent research has shown the challenges the registered sled dog breeds are facing when racing expanded into warmer climates.

The FCI Sledge Dog Commission met on 30 November 2024, in response to the findings of the scientific study *Comparative Population Genomics of Arctic Sled Dogs* (Smith, Srikanth and Huson, September 2024) which shows significant introgression of Alaskan Husky type dogs and European breeds, in part of the registered Siberian Husky population. From the study:

"The finding of European breed introgression in about half of the Siberian dogs that compete in sled dog races, with notable European ancestry in both the Racing and Seppala populations, but minimal admixture in other Siberian populations, supports Alaskan or European breed gene flow into the Siberian Husky after breed formation. Alaskan sled dog or European breed crosses in the Siberian Husky may have been used to introduce performance enhancing alleles from faster and more heat tolerant breeds which would have been advantageous as sled dog racing expanded into warmer climates.

The Alaskan sled dog, primarily bred for performance and lacking formal recognition by kennel clubs, has become a leading competitor in sled dog races, including the Iditarod, winning numerous events across various distances. Although their origins are initially from the native village dogs in Alaska, today they are mainly purpose bred for sprint and distance racing and have included many different breeds in their genetic makeup. Crosses to European breed groups such as sighthounds and pointers have been used to improve speed and heat tolerance in the Alaskan over the past century." (Huson et al 2012)

With the scientific findings at hand, showing that half of the registered Siberian Husky population bred for racing has Alaskan or European breed introgression, it is obvious that measures need to be taken.

To safeguard fair sport competition internationally, the FCI Sledge Dog Commission is committed to work for regulations that ensure only those registered dogs that truly are their breed enter competition for registered sled dog breeds. To protect the breed and the integrity of pedigrees, the commission urges national canine organizations to take measures at registration level for the sled dog breeds. A possible measure could be to provide full pedigrees only to dogs that have tested as single breed (100%) on a genetic test for breed out of genetically tested parents.

According to the guidelines of the FCI Scientific Commission, cross-breeding with other breeds is a measure taken to address a serious health problem in a breed or if the breed has a very small genepool. In the case of the Siberian Husky, cross breeding has been done illegitimately to alter the characteristics of the breed to enhance performance and gain advantage over the competition that runs with single bred Siberian Huskies.

FCI members are urged to take measures at breeding level to uphold FCI Internal Rules (art. 3.2 pt. E).

FCI Sledge Dog Commission specifically refers to the recent *statement on the use of genomic tools* by the FCI General Committee, mentioning that FCI should help to improve the integrity of pedigrees.

The FCI petdoginfo site states that national canine organizations "aspire to be the most effective advocates for purebred dogs in their countries whilst safeguarding the pureness of the purebred genetic pool".

On the scientific resource site of the International Partnership for Dogs (IPFD) it is stated; "Research indicates that the specific development of the Siberian Husky breed means that a genetic test for breed should correlate close to or at 100%, even at high levels of specificity" (Brown et. Al 2015)

The Siberian Husky is not a newly developed breed, it does not have an open studbook, and controlled crosses under kennel club supervision have not occurred in recent history.

The Siberian Husky is an ancient breed from a relatively pure Arctic lineage with a closed studbook since 1930, resulting in a unique and distinct genetic signature. As a result, a purebred Siberian Husky with a documented pedigree should consistently test as a single breed on genetic breed identification tests with no ancestry from other breeds.

FCI Sledge Dog Commission also refers to the statement as published on 4 December 2024 by the breed's parent club in USA: "The Siberian Husky Club of America condemns all cross-breeding of the Siberian Husky". Source: SHCA

Ultimately, it is the responsibility of breeders to keep the breed's studbook trustworthy. As such, the FCI Sledge Dog Commission urges breeders to use genomic tools with high density marker sets in their breeding program, in order to protect the integrity of the ancients sled dog breeds. Despite that the American Kennel Club has chosen to classify the sled dog titles of the breed's parent clubs as club-titles, rather than official AKC titles, it should not be interpreted as a reflection on the working status of the Siberian Husky and Alaskan Malamute. The breeds belong to the AKC Working Group. The breeds' heritage and capabilities as working sled dogs remain unchanged, regardless of the challenges posed by accessibility in a mostly warm-climate country like the United States. The breeds do belong in the FCI nomenclature to the Spitz and Primitive group, section Nordic Sledge Dogs, indicating their northern heritage and function as sled dog. They too should be acknowledged with official FCI working breed status. A goal our commission will keep working for.

SHOW JUDGES COMMISSION

Activity report

Mrs Barbara Mueller, official representative of the FCI Central Committee was present as well.

We would like to extend our warmest thanks to President Dino Muto and his staff for the excellent organisation and smooth running of our annual meeting.

Following the election of the Committee during the vote, I am delighted to welcome Mrs Anne-Marie Class, France, for her re-election as Secretary, and Mr Francesco Cochetti, Italy, as Vice-President.

I myself, Laurent Pichard, have been re-elected as President of the FCI Judges' Commission and I like to thank all Judges Commission members for the trust placed in me and the committee.



I'm delighted to have a close-knit committee at my side, one that is well established in today's cynology and knows all the ins and outs. We were thus able to take into consideration the many points that were raised during our annual meeting in Rome, of which I will list the main ones below.

If you are more interested, I would be grateful if you could read all the details in the minutes which have been published on the FCI website under the heading "FCI Judges Commission, Rome 2 and 3 February 2024".

The most important points to note are, of course, on the one hand, the modification of the judges' directory visible on the FCI website, showing only international judges and no longer national judges, and on the other hand, standardized training between the various national organizations.

This is to try to have a similar level of training between the different national organizations, especially with regard to the length of training for breed and group judges

We must also facilitate the work of the FCI collaborators within their secretariat by firmly requesting all national organizations to keep up to date the information concerning new judges and to provide the complete documents to the FCI office, which must verify if the proposed candidate corresponds in all points to the regulations in force for the appointment of show judges, before their name is published on the FCI website.

The FCI approval and confirmation is required.

We have had a rather eventful year, especially with regard to the decision to no longer publish the list of national judges in the FCI directory. This has, of course, created some turbulence within the FCI secretariat, but this was necessary in order to start again on a clear and solid basis.

Please refer to the FCI website under Show Judges Commissions Rome 2023 for full details of the changes to the Show Judges Regulations which have been approved by the FCI Central Committee.

The FCI Judges Facebook page, in the hands of Frances-co Cochetti, has met with great success and is consulted very regularly. We would remind you that it is reserved for FCI judges only.

There was no judges' congress in 2024, and we look forward to Italy organizing a World Congress in Bologna 2026.

One of the real highlights in the cynological world was, of course, the FCI World Championship Show in Zagreb, which brought together more than 20,000 dogs and many very well experienced judges from all 3 FCI sections. Once again, a huge congratulation to the Croatian Kennel Club, HKS.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to the FCI General Secretariat, which keeps all the documents relating to show judges up to date, and especially to Yves Declerc and Marjorie Grimmelprez.

I would also like to thank Barbara Mueller, our commission representative, who supports and defends our proposals at FCI Central Committee meetings.

Our next meeting will take place in beautiful Riga in 2025 and I look forward to seeing you all there again.

FCI SHOWS COMMISSION

Activity report



After the turbulent period in the last mandate of the FCI Show commission new FCI show commission president, vice president and secretary have been elected.

The Annual Meeting was scheduled and took place at the beginning of February in Roma Italy.

There were 30 delegates.

The meeting was well organized with great hospitality offered by the Italian Kennel Club and president Mr. Dino Muto.

On the occasion of the meeting Mrs. Macarena Pantaleon from Chile was elected for the position of Vice president, Mr. Ozan Belkis from Turkey as Secretary of the commission and Mr. Bojan Mataković from Croatia as Commission President.

The FCI General Committee has adopted the proposal from our commission regarding the new FCI - CACIB distribution for the Toy poodles.

In collaboration with the FCI office, a survey regarding the possibility of exhibiting neutered dogs in the veteran class was conducted.

At the request of the FCI Commission for Shows and Show Judges, the FCI has sent a reminder to its members about the obligation to submit breed standard presentations for their national breeds.

Highlights of 2024

The World Dog Show 2024 was organized in Zagreb, Croatia at the end of April.

The total number of dogs entered was 14.850.

The Americas and Carribean Section Show 2024 was organized by the Kennel Club of Honduras at the middle of March in San Pedro Sula.







The section show in the European Section 2024 was organized by the Slovenian Kennel Club at the begining of October in Celje.

The total number of dogs entered was 10.006.



The section show in the Asia, Africa and Oceania Section 2024 was organized by the Kennel Club of South Korea at the middle of December in Suwon.

The total number of dogs entered was 466.

Statistic of 2024

A total of 1.181 CACIB were entered on the FCI list of the International shows which is almost 10 % more than previous year.

The number is distributed on the sections: Europe 794 CACIB shows, The Americas & Caribbean 162 CACIB shows and Asia, Africa & Oceania 225 CACIB shows.

I would like to thank my colleagues in the Show Commission, Mrs. Macarena Pantaleon and Mr. Ozan Belkis for their work. Also I would like to thank the members of the FCI Show judges commission for great cooperation.

My thanks also go to the FCI office, especially to Mr. Yves De Clercq for his help, and at the end to our representative from the FCI General Committee, Ms. Barbara Müller.

FCI UTILITY DOGS COMMISSION

Activity report

In 2024, 2 meetings of the commission took place, each in Vukovci in Croatia. In addition to general topics and a preview of the upcoming FCI World Championships, a new version of the International Testing Regulations was adopted, which was also approved by the FCI Board on September 8, 2024. A key aspect was to make access to the tests easier for beginners in the sports of companion dogs, tracking dogs and utility dogs. These test regulations come into force on January 1, 2025.

From April 9 to 14, the World Championship for Tracking Dogs was held in Linstow in Germany, in which 48 teams from 21 nations took part, 21 of which passed the test. The world champion came from Slovenia.

The World Championship for Utility Dogs took place in Vinkovci from September 23rd to 29th, 2024. This was the first time that this major event was held in Croatia. 133 dogs took part, of which 73 dogs achieved a positive result.

On November 30th and December 1st, an international judges' conference took place in Austria, in which 110 judges took part. The focus was on changes to the examination regulations so that the findings from this international conference could also be passed on to the judges nationally.

FCI HOOPERS COMMISSION

Activity report



Hoopers is a rather young canine sport that has gained popularity across Europe in the past decade. Hoopers combines fluid handling, distance control, and teamwork between dog and handler. In a changing parcours of hoops, barrels, short tunnels and gates the emphasis lies on excellence rather than speed as there is no time-keeping. Deriving from NADAC hoopers class in North America, hoopers evolved into a distinct sports of its own in Europe. Originally thought to be a low-impact alternative to agility, this may hold true for training where challenges can easily be adjusted to meet the needs of younger, older or even disabled dogs. Competitions however are reserved for healthy dogs who can execute tight turns and smooth changes of directions. The hoopers sport is very inclusive and accessible regarding the human part of the team. Thus, it thrives and attracts a growing number of dog sport enthusiasts. In some countries there are several hundred competitions per year already.

Therefore it was high time that the FCI embraces hoopers to promote, regulate, and unify the sport on an international level. The commission was established in August 2023.

The online kick-off event hosted by Yves de Clercq in November 2023 bringing the 12 delegates together, was followed by a face-to-face meeting in Frankfurt, Germany, in April 2024.

This inaugural personal meeting paved the way for a thriving cooperation. In an exceptionally harmonious and friendly atmosphere, all delegates united to promote their beloved sport.

Sandra Borchert, Germany, was elected president of the hoopers commission, assisted by Kati Wala-Bruin, Finland, as vice-president and Ari Valkhoff-Leclerq, the Netherlands, as secretary.

The objectives are clear:

- 1. Drafting International Regulations: The commission reviewed existing national rules to create a comprehensive and balanced global rulebook that preserves the sport's accessibility while ensuring competitive fairness.
- 2. Developing Unified Judging Guidelines: Establishing clear and objective judging criteria to be used across all sanctioned events, ensuring consistency in scoring and performance evaluation.
- 3. Engaging with Stakeholders: Consulting with national kennel clubs, trainers, handlers, and judges to refine regulations and encourage broad adoption.
- 4. Building Towards a World Championship: Establishing qualification pathways and ranking systems to introduce the first Hoopers World Championship within the next five years.

The hoopers commission is committed to achieve these goals. No less than 6 online meetings in 2024 bring us closer step by step.

Over the next year, the meeting time-table is even tighter, as the commission will focus on finalizing international rules and judging guidelines.

The commission invites collaboration from all stakeholders to ensure the successful growth and recognition of hoopers worldwide. Our overall priority is to position the hoopers sport alongside other major canine disciplines on the global stage while preserving its unifying character.

FCI TRUFFLE SEARCHING COMMISSION

Activity report

The FCI Truffle Seaching Commission was created during the work of the FCI General Assembly in Geneva 21-22 August 2023 as a non-mandatory commission on proposals of SCC (France).

Austria, China, Denmark, France, Italy and later Germany and Switzerland joined the Commission immediately. The first meeting was called by the Executive Director Mr. Y. De Clercq, whom we must thank for his kind availability, on 22 January 2024 during which it was decided to hold a first meeting in person in Italy at the ENCI Headquarters in Milan set for 18 May 2024. Due to health problems for some and delays in flights due to bad weather for others, only Paolo Alessandrini (delegate for Italy) and Mrs. Ilaria Biondi De Ciabatti (Member of the FCI Executive Committee and Liaison Agent in our Commission) were present at the meeting at the ENCI. Given the poor attendance, it was decided at that time to postpone examining the items on the agenda and to set a new meeting at a later time, always convened by Paolo Alessandrini. Due to incompatibility problems between the email servers between the Delegates and the FCI, things dragged on until reaching a new in-person meeting on October 17, 2024 at the "Centro Turistico Valbonella", Bagno di Romagna (FC) Italy during and on side of the Italian Lagotto Club Gathering. In addition to the Liaison Agent Ilaria De Ciabatti (Peru), the following were present at this meeting: Paolo Alessandrini – (Member) Italy Dominique Cornet-Gougon (Member) - France (present via ZOOM), Jaqcueline Egger (Member) - Switzerland, Dörthe Hostling (Member) - Denmark (present via ZOOM), Palma Rodler (Member) - Germa-

ny, Roswihta Szabo (Member) -Austria, as well as representatives of Norway, Sweden, The Netherlands as listeners. During this meeting, Mr. Paolo Alessandrini was elected as President, Mrs. Roswihta Szabo as Vice President, and Mrs. Palma Rodler as Secretary. It is firmly decided to maintain as such and well separated from the rest what concerns the Lagotto Romagnolo which has had a Working Standard and a Trial Regulation approved by the ENCI since 2006 and to which the FCI has granted the release of the CACIT since 2019. Since the ultimate goal of the Trials for the Lagotto Romagnolo is selection and genetic improvement, the activity carried out in the context of this breed goes beyond simple recreational-sporting objectives and the results obtained in all these years confirm what has been stated. The Trials for the Lagotto Romagnolo cannot therefore be mixed with those concerning other dog breeds not specifically for truffle hunting, for which at the moment there is no Standard aimed at this discipline. For the Lagotto Romagnolo, the rules that will govern the International Championship will have to be specified. In any case, the need to prepare a regulation to carry out Truffle Hunting Trials for all other dogs registered in the genealogical books and belonging to breeds not specifically aimed at this activity is highlighted. The operating space is widely available to everyone and therefore it will be the task of our Commission to create the possibility for these subjects to participate in the Trials with very specific methods to allow them to try their hand at this fascinating discipline. To achieve these goals, it was decided to start from the evaluation of the Regulations and the realities

already in place in the individual Countries involved. As regards the programming of the next meetings, it was decided to plan one in remote mode on ZOOM on 17 December 2024 to begin evaluating the requlations and documents that will be shared by the individual members. At the same time, it was already decided that the next in-person meeting will take place on 08 October 2025, again at the VALBONELLA TOURIST CENTRE, LOCALITA' VALBONELLA 38, 47021 BAGNO DI ROMAGNA (FC) Italy. During the meeting held online on the ZOOM platform on December 17, 2024, in which all the Delegates were present, the current realities in the various Countries were initially examined, the attendance currently recorded at the Trials and a certain planning was started on what to prepare to get to the drafting of the regulations that we want to draw up. The timing referred to the few months of the year 2024 during which the Commission operated did not allow us to achieve many objectives set in any case, but the work of the Commission has always seen enthusiastic participation by all the Delegates masterfully followed by our Liaison Agent Ilaria De Ciabatti and I believe that it will be possible to lay the foundations of what we have set ourselves in the best way and in the shortest possible time. This is to get to the point of sharing this discipline in the highest possible number of Countries as soon as possible.

REPORT OF OUR ENGAGEMENT FOR CONTROLLING THE ACCOUNTS CLOSED ON 31/12/2024 TO MEMBERS AT THE ORDINARY GENERAL MEETING OF THE AISBL [INTERNATIONAL NON-PROFIT ORGANISATION] FEDERATION CYNOLOGIQUE INTERNATIONALE

In accordance with our engagement described below and confirmed by our engagement letter of 29 January 2025, here is our report on the control of the financial statements for the fiscal year ended on 31 December 2024. Our task consists in the contractual control of financial statements.

We have inspected the financial statements of the AISBL Fédération Cynologique Internationale for the fiscal year ended on 31 December 2024, established on the basis of the accounting regulations applicable in Belgium. The balance sheet total is €5,516,602.16 and the profit and loss account shows a profit for the year of €92,828.32.

The management body is responsible for establishing financial statements that provide a true and fair view in accordance with the accounting regulations applicable in Belgium, and for setting up the internal controls it finds necessary for the establishment of financial statements free from material misstatements.

In accordance with our engagement letter, our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our inspection. Our inspection has been carried out in accordance with the standard applicable to the contractual control of small and medium enterprises, small (international) non-profit organisations and the reserved and shared legal tasks for small and medium enterprises and small (international) non-profit organisations and foundations. Under that standard, we are required to plan and carry out inspections to make sure that the financial statements do not contain any material misstatements. We have complied with all the ethics requirements that apply to the contractual control of financial statements in Belgium, including those relating to independence, as provided in said standard.

Our control entails the use of procedures such as those provided in the standard relating to the contractual control of small and medium enterprises and small (international) non-profit organisations and foundations and the reserved and shared legal tasks for small and medium enterprises and small (international) non-profit organisations and foundations, in order to collect audit evidence about the amounts and information provided in the financial statements. The choice of procedures used, including a limited assessment of the risk of the financial statements containing

material misstatements, is made on the basis of the professional judgement of the chartered

accountant. While carrying out that risk assessment, we have defined control procedures that are appropriate for the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the internal control of the AISBL Fédération Cynologique Internationale.

We believe that the evidence obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, in accordance with the provisions of the standard on the contractual control of small and medium enterprises and small (international) non-profit organisations and foundations and the reserved and shared legal tasks for small and medium enterprises and small (international) non-profit organisations and foundations, the enclosed financial statements provide a true and fair view of the assets and financial position of the organisation on 31 December 2024, and its results for the fiscal year ended on that date, in accordance with the accounting regulations applicable in Belgium.

This report may not be used for other purposes and its publication shall be limited to the use provided in the engagement letter.






BALANCE SHEETS (as of December 31st, 2024)




PROFIT AND LOSS ACCOUNT




