REQUIREMENTS TO GET THE TITLE OF INTERNATIONAL AGILITY CHAMPION (C.I.AG.)

a. CACIAG (Certificat d'Aptitude au Championnat International d'Agility)

The winner, with a clear round, of the FCI grade 2 or grade 3 competition (grade 2 only in those countries which do not have competitions in grade 3), in each category (S-M-L) in an International Agility Competition, will be awarded a "CACIAG".

b. Reserve-CACIAG

The dog placed second, with a clear round, in the FCI grade 2 or grade 3 competition (grade 2 only in those countries which do not have competitions in grade 3), in each category (S-M-L) in an International Agility Competition, will be awarded a "R-CACIAG" which will be converted in "CACIAG" should the winner of the competition be already International Agility Champion.

c. International Agility Competition

Will be considered as International Agility Competitions (with the FCI authorization) the competitions for which an application will have been made to the FCI by the country of the organizing club in the limit of the number of international competitions authorized, i.e. a possible minimum of 4 competitions per country and a maximum corresponding to 10% of the total of the official competitions organized by that country.

An International Agility Competition will be compulsorily judged by one or several qualified judges authorized by their country to judge abroad (see FCI list).

d. Title of "International Agility Champion"

Are eligible to apply for the title of "International Agility Champion" (S-M-L) any dog registered with a stud book recognized by the FCI which will have earned:

- 2 CACIAG in two different countries under 2 different judges over a minimum period of one year and one day
- At least the grading "Good" in a show sanctioned by the FCI

Every country will propose to the FCI its candidates for the title of International Agility Champion and will provide the relevant documents.

e. Enforcement

The present regulations will be effective from January 1st, 1999.

N.B.: Agility is not a discipline for breed selection. Consequently, the CACIAG or the R-CACIAG or the title of "International Agility Champion" do not allow to enter a dog in the working class in shows.
